

Reports from committee

1. Postal committee popay Watanabe and Eiichi Sakumye saw Mr. I. Ouye and presented him some improvements and suggestions, but was informed to wait a while and see how this present system works out. In order to make two deliveries, it will be necessary to get another truck.
2. Mr. Fujii reported that there are no stoves available for the Block offices. The parts have been order three or four months ago, but has not arrived. Mr. Erdman stated that if there are any stoves in the area that is not in use, notify the maintenance division; so they could put it in the offices. A suggestion was made to take it out of the men's shower room, as it is not being used in most of the blocks.
3. Brooms, sops and mop handles for Block Offices should be reported to the foremen of the janitors when he comes around.

Old Business

1. The Chairman asked the Managers who failed to turn in their leaders name for the Relocation Educational Body to do so immediately.
2. Brooms are not available for the Center residents as there are only 150 brooms to be used for mess hall and latrine, etc.

New Business

The following suggestions were submitted.
