Reports from committee

1. Relocation Committee, George Nakaki, reported that the evacuees may have an unlimited weight of freights from the Center to the Relocation Area. He also stated that the residents of Relocation centers will be eligible to go out on indefinite leave for a trial period of from four to six months and may secure permission to return to the Center at the end of that time if found necessary.

Dave Yamakawa and Laura Fujiye from the C. A. came to the meeting. Dave stated that one reason for his visit was to open up the rec. halls that are still closed. He asked the Managers to coordinate any requests to his department, that is, if there are any request for repairs, improvements, and etc., bring the matter up before the B.M. meeting first, and then send it down to the C. A. He asked the Managers who were interested in securing the chairs that were ordered for the theaters, to come and see it. The cost per chair is \$1.50. He also stated that the biggest problem of the rec. halls was the lack of supervision of the games and suggested on having interested parents to supervise games.

Old Business

1. Managers were asked to see Swish on securing C. T. for overtime worked during the taking of the census.
2. Mr. Kizu stated that the trash forman requested the Managers to inform the residents to pile the waste materials along the road so that it may be picked up during the Clean up Week, and not behind the mess halls
