Absentest Hone Tardy: Meavrs. Chasaki and Metoyoshi.

Minutes of November 27 meeting were read and approved without correction. Gommunication from the Robser Community Council, Committee for Study of Relocation Problems was reviewed and referred to the Council Resettlement through the Council accordance to pass a resolution to propose WMA through the Project Director to call a conference on relocation problems and procedures with delegates from the nine centers. The letter from Mashington WMA office addressed to all Project Directors and relocation supervisors dated October 25, 1943 was referred to the Council in elaboration of the motion by Mr. Sashiharm. Notion was seconded and passed unanimously.

Mr. Tom Oki, Council Food Committee, reported on mechigome, milk supply, snacks for children up to 12 years of age, bakery, and tofu.

Mr. Nakachina reported on the Administration's intention concerning firing all stoves in latrines, laundry rooms, and recreation halls.

Various proposals were submitted for discussion today.

Block 29 proxy councilman, Nr. Okagaki's proposal for the supply of bushets and brooms and other surplus items to residents were referred to Block Managers.

The Council passed motion to request the Administration to issue clothing allowmoss to those who are unemployed due to lack of employment even if they are willing to work. The Executive and Social Welfage Committees were assigned to negotiate the matter with Nr. Tobertson.

Health and Sanitation Committee was referred on nurse' sides problem to study its function and clarify wrong conception re it.

The Council passed Mr. Saito's proposal to present a Christmas gift to each evadues physician and surgeon at the hampital. It was unanisously agreed by all councilson that each block contribute \$13 with an exception of Block 7 whose quota was set for \$7.50 and bring it to the Council office by Suesday, December 18, 1983.

Reduction of sales prices of morchandise sold at the community enterprise stores was proposed by Mr. Saito. Mr. Ritchie moved that the Council Community Enterprise Committee study its feasibility and submit to the Council definite recommendations. Motion passed.

He transportation of farm implement now on the west coast to the point of recettlement for immediate use, the Council secretary explained that the Evacues Property office will handle its execution, but transportation expenses have to be paid by the evacues owner. However, commercial property is not from in California against shipment cutside of state. (Information obtained from Mr. H. Burnett, Evacues Property Officer.)

Mr. Eitchie proposed to increase coal piles in the block. The Housing Committee under the Social Welfare Committee was assigned to request that a coal pile be provided at the street and of each barrack.

The Legal Committee was assigned to find out regulation restricting postering on the wall sof buildings wibtout permission.

Moeting was adjourned till 9:30 AM, Friday, December 3, 1943.
