Minutes of November 30 meeting were read and passed without correction.

Following communications were reviewed by the Council. Mr. Myer to Mr. Robertson by a teletype message suggesting a discussion on and appraisal of situation in this center reported to him concerning the anniversary of "the Pearl Harbor Day". (quota tion is the expression used by Mr. John M. Costello of the Dies Committee in the letter to Mr. Myer)

Memorandum from Mr. Main to the Council on mess hall personnel and ratings.

Former warehouse \$17 crew members reported five of them had been terminated as of Movember 29 on the ground of insubordination, and made an appeal to the Council to arbitrate the discharged with proper authority for their reinstatement to the former position. The Labor Committee was requested to take charge of the matter.

Mr. Iwamura of Block 14 informed of his intention to publish a literary magazine in Japanese and obtained the Council's approval. He informed that the English a translation of a copy for every issue will be submitted to the Reports Division and the proceeds of 15 cents per copy will be forwarded to the Community Activities section as a future fund.

The Welfare Committee was asked to take up a matter of tembetones and religious coremonias in setting them up.

Above mentioned Administrative staff have reported to the Touncil meeting to go ever the agenda which had been submitted to the Project Director for discussion. Mr. Main, Pracurement Officer, took up the matters of mess workers club's petition and milk supply. The former subject will be taken up by himself at the Denver conference to be held during next week. Only means for us to do on the latter problem is to make a direct appeal to the Washington WAA authority.

Mr. Lane, Manufacturing Superintendent of the Industry section, went over the tofu production here. Should get started within a week or ten days, he asserted.

Mr. Munley, Fire Protection Officer, discussed on improper wiring. He explained that wiring is not the main cause for fire hazards, but rather home installations such as hot plates and improper installation of extention cords are direct cause for fire danger. Inspection to date revealed 470 cases of such dangerous installations. Overloading fuses is another violation. No more than three cords should be allowed, he contended.

Mr. Carroll, Chief of Employment Division, expressed his opinion on the Council's resolution recently passed on relocation conference. 't will certainly be approved by Washington, he ascertained. Mr. H ffman from Washington also concurred on the resolution, he said.

Mr. Ryan, Assistant Project Director, along with Mr. Larson, Cost Accountant, followed on the question of workness's compensation. The Appropriation Act of Congress, February 1934, Statute 48 provides rate of compensation for GCC and WFA workers. This Act is applicable to evacuess in the relocation centers. Temporarily injured receives two thirds of his wege plus his clothing allowance plus subsistence and quarters (\$16.00, 3.75, 19.00, 6.50, respectively) minus subsistence and quarters during the period he receives the compensation for a persons getting \$16.00 per month. If permanently injured, such figures for subsistence and quarters shall not be deducted. This compensation applies only of the Husband's income for widow; 10% for each child under 18 years of age. Maximum rate for a family is set for 66.2/3%.

On the question of issuance of police uniform, Mr. Anderson, Assistant Project Director, informed there is no way whereby any WMA fund can provide police uniforms to evacues policemen. Such a fund should come from outside of WMA fund.

The proposed ordinance on restriction of the use of fire hydrant was a dopted by the Council with a rescission of a few wording. Its publicationwas withheld pending the Project Trector's approval.

Meeting was adjourned till 9:30 AM, Tuesday, December 7, 1943.
