Minutes of March 28 was read and corrected to read Relocation Representative Committee instead of Relocation representative.

Chairman announced to review the Community Council Charter at recent meeting.

Mr. Katagi reported that U.S.O. accepted our request to take initiative to entertain and to ask Boy Scouts to participate in sendoff of inductees. He reported also the books, musical instrument, goh, and shogi were received by the Community Activities and added that it was the request of Dave Yamakawa of the Community Activities to the Community To take action for distribution. The matter was left on table due to the fact that all items reported to have been sent have not arrived.

With the suggestion from Mr. Iwasaki, Chairman advised the Labor Committee and the Agriculture Committee to confer the matter of Saijo versus poultry workers with the agriculture divisional heads for further investigation.

It was announced by the chairman that four carloads of coal arrive daily to the center.

Mr. Robertson gave report of Washington Conference which was attended by all directors of the projects and the members of Myer's staff. Following discussion took place.

1. Relocation Problem.

. 2. Construction of Property on the Project.

3. Reduction of Expenditures.

4. Agriculture Program.

Jerome Center will be closed at the end of June and 1000 residents are scheduled to be transferred here. They will be accommodated into the rooms vacated by 250 transferees to Tule Lake and by expectative leaves of 500 and also seasonal leaves.

He appraised the efficiency of project labor under present condition. He reported that much liberalized regulations of evacuee property movement will be sent in the near future; that all project farm is to raise produces sufficient for project consumption.

Following requests to Mr. Robertson were made:

- 1. To Expedite construction of Rest Home for aged.
- 2. To secure materials to improve living conditions.
- 3. To supply sufficient coal for the resident' use.

In regard to quest of Mr. Hayashida, Mr. Robertson stated that West Coast sentiment is improving but he did not make any specific statement of our return.

Meeting adjourned at 11:55 AV.
