Meeting was called to order by Chairman Nakashima.

ROLL CALL

Absentee: Mr. T. Oka (23-EX)

Attended: Dr. M. Itatani, optometrist and Mr. M.O. Anderson, Assistant Project Director.

COMMUNICATIONS REVIEWED:

1. From Minidoka Community Council in regards to Items Supplied by WRA to Project Residents.
2. From D. George Diehl, Statistician, a letter of appreciation for the interest taken in regards to the main gate passes.
3. From M.O. Anderson, Assistant Project Director, on Franking Privilege by Community Council; Social Security Benefits; and Relocation Grants for Inductees.

SPEAKER:

Dr. Itatani explained the situation on optical instruments. He stated that he was using his equipment for the benefit of the evacuees. Under the WRA regulation all of the glasses should be ordered outside. At present it is impossible to buy any optical equipment, therefore, he would like to retain his equipment and would be willing to use it if he could be reimbursed. Service for the evacuees was the first consideration.

Mr. Anderson stated that the Jerome transferees will arrive next week and that the Community Activities will sponsor a welcome reception. An accurate list of new residents in each block will be given to the Councilmen by Miss. Payne, Senior Counselor, so the Councilmen in turn can welcome these new residents in their respective blocks. The induction procedure used previously will again be followed. To Mr. Hatchimonji's request that a list of persons coming from Jerome be published, Mr. Anderson said he will try to have a list of names with addresses published. Mr. Anderson also reported that efforts are being made to provide janitorial services for recreation halls as soon as possible. He also announced that the new Project Attorney will be coming about next week.

1. SWIMMING POOL:

Mr. Iwasaki, Block 1 Councilman, proposed to expedite the opening of the swimming pool. Motion was unanimously passed. The Education and Recreation Committee was asked to negotiate with the Administration.

2. ADULT BASEBALL TEAM:

Mr. Katagi conveyed Tak Shiozaki's request that names of manager and captain of the Old Men's Teams be turned in to him so that he can schedule games for the Adult Baseball Teams with the various blocks.

3. SCHOLARSHIP FUND:

Mr. Katagi reported that the Education and Resolution Committees will go to the undecided blocks and have them reconsider this matter. Up to date, eleven blocks have approved.

4. OLD MEN'S HOME:

Mr. Wakaki stated that the Council was requested to refer applicants for residence at home of the aged.

Meeting was adjourned at 11:30 a.m.
