Meeting was called to order by Chairman Nakashima.

ROLL CALL

Absentees: Block 14, Mr. S. Saijo, and Block 24.

1. HOSPITAL CONMITTEE

The Chairman made a request for the following blocks to submit the name of their representative to serve on the Hospital Committee as soon as possible: Blocks 14, 17, 22, and 24.

2. RED CROSS REPRESENTATIVES

The Chairman requested the following blocks to submit names of representatives to serve on the Red Cross: Blocks 6, 9, 17, and 22.

Request was made by Mr. Peter Osuga asking the Council to appoint a Chairman for the Red Cross group. It was unanimously agreed that Mr. Minokichi Tsunokai serve as Chairman. Memorandum will be sent to Mr. Osuga.

3. SPANISH VICE-CONSUL

The requests made by the Spanish Vice-Consul, Captain Martin, were taken up.

a. Name, address, and sex of all Japanese Nationals.

b. Name, address, and sex of applicants who have asked for repatriation and expatriation.

Mr. G. Nakaki made a motion that this matter be referred to the Council. Motion was unanimously passed.

The Chairman asked that the petitions presented to the Spanish Vice-Consul be clarified.

4. IN APPRECIATION

It was reported that Mr. Take Kawasaki, 22-15-C, contributed several hundreds of wooden spoons gratis which are used for serving rice to the mess halls. It was unanimously decided to write him a letter in appreciation in behalf of the community. Mr. Nagumo was appointed to draft the letter in Japanese.

5. Mr. Hayashida made a report on his interview with the Project Attorney, Byron Ver Ploeg, on the matter of the scholarship fund. The Council requested that Mr. Ver Ploeg by asked to come and clarify further on this subject, which he did.

Mr. K. Hatchimonji made a motion to have the election tomorrow re. the scholarship contribution, August 11, as scheduled provided that Mr. Ver Ploeg's advice is printed in the bulletin and delivered today. The motion was unanimously passed. Messrs. Hayashida and Hatchimonji were instructed by the chairman to draft the above mentioned report. Later, the report was read to the Council and approved as follows:

Scholarship Fund Vote Tomorrow

With residents to vote on the \$2400 scholarship fund pallot between 12 m.-7 p.m. temerrow at booths to be established at each mess hall, the community council made the following announcement this merning concerning the measure:

"We at first decided to get the scholarship fund from the community enterprises unclaimed fund but later we learned that there was a doubt as to the legality of using the unclaimed fund for the purpose. Therefore, we have changed the wording on the ballot to read, 'Do you favor a donation by the trustees of Heart Mountain Community Enterprises to the Heart Mountain Scholarship Fund of \$2400,' not stating exactly from which fund the money was to be taken.

"This morning our project attorney, Byron Ver Ploeg, gave his opinion on this matter as follows: 'The ballot papers will be used to determine the sentiment of the people toward the scholarship fund. The final decision whether the fund is to be given rests with the trustees of the community enterprises. Although there is some doubt as to the legality of using the unclaimed fund for the purpose, there is practically no difficulty for diverting it for the purpose.'

"We ask the voters to consider all the circumstances and use their ballet in the wisest possible manner in this first referendum we are going to have since the granting of the city charter."
