NEW BUS.
MOTION

REPORTS
HOSPITAL

Miss Van Kirk reported of the difficulty the hospital has in obtaining blood donors. Mr. Anderson stated that he requested the Community Council to secure volunteers from the blocks. Discussion was held and it was suggested that David Yamakawa appeal to the Young People's Club in regard to this problem. It was also suggested that the Block managers make an effort to draft one nurses' aid from each block.

SOCIAL
WELFARE

A report from the Social Welfare section was given. The two points reported were: Counseling Program for relocation and Welfare reports for the 3 boys delinquent from draft who are in both Mc Neill Island and Fort Lavenworth. A welfare report on these boys in regard to their individual character and social data has been requested by the Welfare department of Justice. The purpose in having this information was to better understand the person and to be used for the benefit of the person for whom it is requested. Discussion was held.

MEMORIAL
SERVICE

David Yamakawa of Community Activities gave a report on the Community-Wide Memorial Service for men lost in action. The general plan for this Service was explained and attached program distributed.

RELOCATION

Mr. R^Uah asked the council for suggestions to get the news of job opportunities and relocation to the home sooner than have been done in the past, particularly the emergency news. Discussion was held.

CARNIVAL

Announcement was made by the Community Activities of the Carnival being planned for September and requested the cooperation of the council.
