

Banking Facilities

Arrangements are being made with the Shoshone National Bank to establish a branch office here. Details of its opening will be announced later.

Housing Adjustments

Necessary housing adjustments will be made as soon as possible. A certain amount of crowding will be necessary due to an anticipated increase in population over the 10,000 for which the Heart Mountain Camp was designed.

New Arrivals

The first contingent of approximately 1100 Colonists from the North Portland (Oregon) Center, the majority of them formerly residents of Yakima Valley in Washington, are expected Sunday.

After this group an undetermined number of colonists are scheduled to arrive from the Santa Anita Center.

Visits By Nisei Soldiers

Nisei serving in the U.S. Army will visit their parents and relatives here on furloughs after induction and housing arrangements are completed. Details will be announced later.

Barber Shops, Stores, Post Office

Barber shops and additional stores and field post will be opened as soon as space is made available for them.

Two stores are now in operation. One at Block 25, the other at Block 8, Building 25. Hours are from 11:45 a.m. and 12:45 to 5:30 p.m.

One post office sub-station is now in operation at Block 26. Temporarily all mail is delivered to this office. After the establishment of other sub-stations, Block 1 will serve blocks 1 through 22.

The main post office is located at Block 23, 24, 30 and 31.

Banking

Before cold weather a protected area will be built around the outside of the ground. Colonists are urged to plant vegetable gardens or other improvements.

Study fire regulations posted about the camp. They must be followed strictly in order to avoid the danger of fire.

In case of fire go to the nearest telephone and notify the fire department. Telephones are located as follows:

Intersections of blocks:	1-2-5-6;	26-27-28;

One fire barrel and two buckets are provided for every three barracks. It is imperative that the buckets be kept at the barrel at all times. It is prohibited to use these fire buckets for other purposes. Remember the safety of your home and your neighbors' home may depend on those fire buckets.

Rubbish is to be emptied in cans placed at the end of barracks. Pick-up service for these cans may not be as efficient as it could be for the first few days. If the can is full do not dump rubbish beside the can. Provide some kind of an additional receptacle.

Releases and Transfers

Persons desiring to be released from Heart Mountain for private re-location may submit written applications with full details to the director, Mr. C. E. Rachford. This application must contain detail reasons for desiring to leave Heart Mountain, assurance that the individual will be accepted by the community to which he desires to move, and proof of money to support himself.

Persons desiring to be transferred to other WRA camps, or have others transferred to this camp are requested to wait until the induction period is ended and Heart Mountain is better known. Further information will be made available.

Schools

Elementary grade and high schools will be held in the barracks classrooms.

Regulations

Within the boundaries of the occupied area, no one is to be permitted to leave without a pass.

Only police guard except in case of fire.

Persons are not to be admitted in the warehouse.
