and he was treated as one of their family.

I really appreciate your kind favor you have done for us about our furniture and I don't know how to express in words. About my refrigerator I do not ~~plan~~ want to sell right now. I know they wanted to buy it but I know too that I wouldn't be able to buy again, and beside we have no use of money while in the camp, so I would like to keep it. I think it would be trouble for you keeping it, but I'll appreciate very much. Many friends that have left their furnitures home are either stolen or burned up. So I am happy that you are looking for us.

Miss Takagi is here now from
Tululake and she is teaching
4 deaf and dumb people. She
is doing very good and I
heard her folks are in Ohio
so she is planning to go soon as
she gets her clearance from Washington.
Well, so far to day. Give
my best regards to your
husband and wishing all
a merry Christmas and
Happy New Year.
