FROM: Judicial Commissioners

SUBJECT: To establish a strong Court system.

It is of primary importance to have a strong, efficient, and effective court or judicial system along with a strong Police Department in order to maintain peace and order of this project. However, at the present, the Judicial Commission is provided with commissioners only who act as judge and jury, but ~~no prosecutor, no defense counsel, no court clerk, no interpreter, no reporters,~~ are provided for in the present court staff. 5人の欠乏

In order to execute the responsibilities of the Judicial system properly, efficiently, and effectively, and in order to maintain dignity and to have the respect of the residents of this project et to the satisfaction of both the administration and the residents, it is absolutely necessary to have the above mentioned personnel or court staff until such time as the new charter will become effective. Without some semblance of a dignified court trial, we do not believe that there is any use of having a Judicial system in this project.

Therefore, we request that the above mentioned staff be established immediately effective before the close of work on January 11th, together with the necessary secretaries, equipment, and place.
