WRA Digest of Current Job Offers For Period of April 16 to April 30, 1944 Investigated And Approved By This Office

SUMMARY OF CURRENT JOB OFFER SITUATION

Jobs for both issei and nisei in Chicago are still increasing in number. Defense plants, particularly, in the iron and steel industry, are demanding the younger men regardless of draft classifications. Even more interesting is the fact that the issei are preferred by a great many employers. Permanent work is available in hotels, factories, and private homes. The Chicago Garage Association, for example, with almost four hundred garages holding membership, has scores of openings for older men as mechanics, car washers, car hikers, etc. Citizenship status, in most cases, is not considered an important factor.

Older men will also be sought for seasonal work on farms. Through the cooperation of the Farm Extension Service and the War Food Administration, a local truck farmer has just employed the first crew to leave a center under the new seasonal leave plan. Opportunities of this nature are expected to increase in the very near future.

SUMMARY OF CURRENT HOUSING SITUATION

The Chicago office is offering an additional service to prospective resettlers. This consists of acting as a clearing house for advance reservations for temporary housing.

Cooperating with the WRA office are the YWCA Room Registry and the YMCA Hotel. Rooms made available through the YWCA vary in price from \$1.00 a day up as do those of the YMCA Hotel. In addition, an arrangement has been made with the owner of a large residence located in a fashionable street on the south side whereby temporary quarters may be obtained at \$1.00 per person per day. Meals may be provided at \$1.00 per day and residence is limited to a temporary period. Close cooperation is maintained with the housing section of the Chicago WRA in order to maintain this Drexel Boulevard home as emergency quarters.

During the past month, two rooming houses have been opened by issei. These will cater to both Japanese and Caucasian trade. Several smaller residences have already been established by resettlers who are making kitchenette and furnished rooms available.
