COMMITTEE REPORTS

1. Community Enterprises

Mr. T. Tsunokai reported on his interview with the C.E. Board of Trustees concerning Mr. K. Hatchimonji's request that the present policy of the C.E. stores be moderated so that goods purchased may be exchanged or returned when unusable. Mr. Tsunokai stated that the Trustees were agreeable and the stores will take back purchases under certain circumstances.

2. C.E.S.N.

After full discussion at a special meeting held last Saturday, it was agreed to dissolve the Community Enterprises Study and Negotiation Committee.

3. Scholarship Fund

A prolonged discussion was held on the legality of the Scholarship Fund Campaign. It was decided to hold a special meeting tomorrow and have Mr. Byron Ver Ploeg, Project Attorney, present to clarify the matter.

4. Food Committee

Mr. M. Hayashida reported that there being a shortage of workers in the tofu factory, the factory may have to close if six more workers are not available soon.

Since a critical labor shortage is prevalent throughout the center, Mr. S. Nakashima suggested that the matter be referred to the Labor Committee. It was agreed that the committee confer with Mr. William B. McFarlane, Personnel Officer, to remedy the situation.

5. Memorial Services

Mr. H. Matsushige's suggestion that a Block Manager offer condolences at the memorial services was agreed to by the Council.

6. Miss Payne's Farewell

Miss Virgil Payne, Social Welfare Supervisor, is to leave Saturday for a new position in Cleveland, Ohio, where she will be employed as Assistant Relocation Supervisor of the Great Lakes area.

It was decided that a farewell dinner be given in her honor at Mess Hall 15-30 at 7:30, Wednesday evening.

Messrs. R. Katagi, H. Tonooka, and H. Matsushige were appointed as a committee to take charge of the arrangements.

7. Scholarship Fund

Mr. Frank Inouye, Student Relocation Council Representative, made his appeal in behalf of the 3,000 nisei students now attending universities and colleges throughout America. He stressed the fact that the future of the Japanese in America rests on the young people of today, therefore, the cooperation of the residents was asked to help enable more worthy students receive higher education by making the Scholarship Fund Campaign a success.

8. Election Board

Mr. S. Nakashima reported that the members who serve on the election board committee will have excused absences during elections.

9. Nurses Aides

Mr. M. O. Anderson, Assistant Project Director, stressed the desperate need for nurses aides in the center hospital which is greatly understaffed at present. He suggested that a house to house canvass be made in each block. In that manner, it might be possible to persuade two new aides from every block to serve the community.
