SUMMARY OF CURRENT JOB CEFER SITUATION

As layoffs in Minneapolis war plants continue, placements in factory lines are becoming more difficult but the determined resettler who is willing to work can be placed in any of a variety of jobs. Floaters and individuals not willing to take a serious attitude toward finding a job and holding it are becoming increasingly difficult to place. In general, persons taking a serious attitude toward their own resettlement need anticipate no difficulties, however, in securing proper placement and satisfactory resettlement here.

We continue to experience no end of difficulties in placing young men with a draft classification of 1-A. Defense employers always and an increasing number of other employers are very hesitant in granting interviews to men in 1-A classification or those in the age group which may soon become 1-A. These men must be content with any job in which they can make a living.

SUMMARY OF CURRENT HOUSING SITUATION

There is no change in our local housing situation and resettlers are continuing to find reasonably satisfactory quarters although considerable looking is necessary.
