Trusting that this letter will find you all well and in good health at Sebastopol.


I received your air mail letter and am answering it right away today.

Well, Mrs. Perry, thats about all we can say regarding Mr. Winkler's recent proposition and I am only sorry to say that we cannot accept it as our new deal for next year.
