Uncle Johnny has told me that you were acquainted with a person by the name of Mrs. Charles Witter who works or had worked on behalf of the Red Cross Organization couple of years back.

Anyway, Grandad at that time had given his time and the use of his car in driving her around for the Red Cross burpose and therefore we were thinking that such a incident although trifle might in some way help Grandad out because of his contributing to worthy causes. Could you please, Mrs. Perry, get in touch with this lady and ask her if she wouldn't write a little statement in affidavit form to the foregoing facts. If she ways she doesn't want to do it, its perfectly all right and just let it go at that but if she is willing to do it, will you please send it to me and then I can immediately forward it to Grandad where it may help him a great deal in his case.

Thank you very much for this favor and hope that I didn't put you to a lot of bother.
