I am writing to tell you that our freight finally arrived yesterday. Everything I wanted came including the box of canned goods I asked about before. There must have been a mistake on my part. I appreciate it very much for all the trouble you went to to get the canned goods. We thought that there was supposed to be 1 trunk, 2 boxes and 1 more box full of canned goods but now we found out that there was a mistake. One of the two boxes which you found was the canned goods, so our memory must have slipped a little. And about the "Miso." Thanks again for going to all that trouble and then sending it under the cellar. We sure must have caused you a lot of worry.

How are the apples coming along this year? Are the crops going to be big? I hope everything is coming along okay. I guess you will be pretty busy this year with all this labor shortage. I imagine the wages are pretty high out there now. Out here in Colorado, wages are pretty low compared to wages in Calif.

It's getting pretty warm out here nowadays but the wind still blows and when it blows it sure does get dusty and sandy. It's pretty hard to breathe and see too. I bet you are having pretty good weather out there now.
