The weather here has been pretty lousy the last few weeks. It's been snowing and raining and the sun hardly ever shines. I guess the farm crops out here will come out later than usual because of the cold and rainy weather.

My wife is going to a class in English now and is in need of a dictionary. If it doesn't cause too much trouble for you could you please look in the black, walnut colored
