The Japanese flag has the name Gentoku Miyagi written large on it, and the young man holding the flag is in soldier uniform but without rank and was therefore probably not yet on active duty when the picture was taken. The older couple are apparently father and mother, while the young friend or brother in the picture is in a middle school uniform. This picture was found in a Naha cave by an American Naval Petty Officer during the Battle of Okinawa in 1945. Along with twelve other pictures and some documents found in the same place, this picture was recently turned in to the Army Information Office in the hope of finding a claimant. The documents found with the pictures were Okinawan and Japanese.
