SURRENDER IN GUAM-TAIRA KOSHUIN, 32, JAPANESE HOLD-OUT FROM WORLD WAR II WHO WAS CAPTURED ON THE ISLAND OF GUAM RECENTLY, USED THE PUBLIC ADDRESS SYSTEM ABOARD A NAVY SHIP, CALLING TO HIS COMPANIONS ON THE BEACH TO SURRENDER. HIS EFFORTS WERE SUCCESSFUL, FOR TWO HOURS LATER HIS FOUR COMPANIONS SURRENDERED TO LT. COMDR. C.R. CARLI, USN, OF BOSTON, MASS., A MEMBER OF THE STAFF OF REAR ADMIRAL E.W. LITCH, USN, COMMANDER NAVAL FORCES, MARIANAS. THE FIRST JAPANESE WHO SURRENDERED, PICTURED HERE, STATED THAT THEY KNEW OF THREE OTHER JAPANESE HOLD-OUTS ON THE ISLAND OF GUAM. THE U.S. NAVY WILL ATTEMPT TO CONTACT THE THREE JAPANESE AND OBTAIN THEIR SURRENDER LATER.
