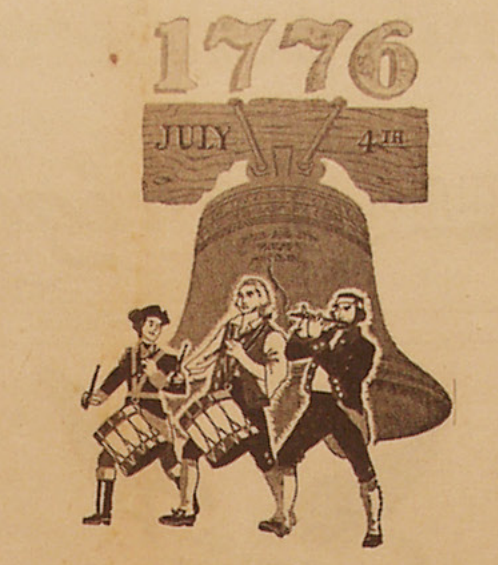

ment is to secure these rights; (3) governments deprive their just powers from the consent of the governed; (4) whenever any form of government becomes destructive of these ends it is the right of the people to alter or abolish it and institute new government...

Today, in a world torn by the horrors and injustices of war, the full impact of that day is again brought home to the minds of all Americans.

The armies of the United Nations are fighting in many lands to rid the world of injustice, hypocrisy and discrimination, but it is the duty of all people to practice the doctrines for which they are fighting for.

Today, though the armies of America are fighting for the Four Freedoms, there are many people who are citizens but are unable to enjoy all the benefits and responsibilities of this country.

This year, many persons of Japanese ancestry in the United States will once again observe this great day within the confines of a relocation center. We who have had our liberties curtailed and in some respects taken away altogether, realize more than ever before the value of the Four Freedoms.

Today, many men whose faces are Japanese but who are American in heart and mind, are out there proving their loyalty and worth in the uniform of their country.

Let's Play Safe

Among the rules of the Selective Service Act are; (1) all men who are of military age must register with their local draft boards, (2) and they must carry with them at all times their registration card.

Therefore, it is best for all draft-age men to carefully check their records and meet the above mentioned requirements if they are in doubt as to their status.

If a resident male does not have a registration card or his classification, it will be of extreme value to write to his local board requesting clarification concerning his status, and to keep a carbon copy of this letter, so that in the event the authorities wish to check up on an evacuee, it will be easier to explain the cause for not having a registration card.

One of the things which will not serve to help us get any favorable reaction or publicity is the failure to comply with the rules of the Selective Service Act.

Therefore, it is of great importance that an evacuee male or a prospective relocatee, check his draft status. If a person is in doubt as to correct procedure there are persons on the project who are in a position to give sound and helpful advice, for instance, Mr. F. Barrett, project attorney, Mr. Elmer Smith, community analyst, or members of the Community Council.

Check up on your requirements and let's play it safe.
