MIDSUMMER CONCERT TONIGHT



2,502 VOTERS TO CAST BALLOTS

The Recreation Department will sponsor a midsummer concert of classical and semi-classical vocal and instrumental music this evening in Section 6 beginning at eight o'clock.

The Men's Glee director, Madeline Yamane and the Women's Glee director, Harue Morinaga have arranged the program. Ray Egashira will accompany the Men's Glee and Hisayo Morinaga will be accompanist for the Women's Glee. Roy Nishimura will be the announcer.

The program for the evening is published in full herein on page 3.

2502 voters are eligible to go to the polls Friday from 8 A.M. to 5 P.M. to cast their ballots for 21 members to form a panel from which 7 will be appointed by the Center Manager to form the Advisory Council. As the paper goes to press 30 candidates have filed for the panel positions.

Voting will take place in the main lobby where 3 tables with 5 booths each will be set up. Each voter will register at the table where the list of prospective voters are arranged alphabetically. Those whose last names begin from A through K will register at table # 1, M through R at table # 2, and S through Z at table # 3. Each person will be allowed to cast their secret ballot for 21 people, any ballot with more than 21 votes will be automatically cast out.

Mr. Carl Trowbridge, Mr. Leo Rush, and Mr. Guy Becker comprise the election committee which is in charge of the details of the election.

EVACUEES MUST REGISTER PROPERTY

The playground was the scene of a major attraction on Saturday—the Model Airplane Contest. With the exception of those confined to work or apartments, the entire populace was out to view this contest, the first of its kind to be held in this Center.

William Koyama was acclaimed winner of the Class A, large flying scale division with Masao Ouchida in second place. Isaac Tomita's endurance model emerged victorious with an average time of 19 seconds in the Class C, open non-scale division. There was a tie for second place as both John Okazaki and Kiyoshi Ito's planes remained in flight for an average time of 11 seconds. Third place

All evacuees whose property in the defense-rental areas are not yet registered are requested to do so immediately. If rentable property is being handled by an agent it is advised that the owners make certain that he has filed the property.

The rent law covers all types of dwelling units, but not commercial structures unless any portion is used for dwelling accommodations. It does not include farm land or any dwellings on it except when the buildings are used solely for the purpose of residence.

Registration forms will be available soon by applying to the Center manager. Requests should be made not later than August 15.

JOB OF CONSTRUCTING

Wooden fact: 56,740' board feet of lumber. To utilize all that into products has been the tremendous job of the Maintenance Department and the Paint Shop. The products can be seen wherever one's eyes rest, for among the constructions are: apartment, canteens, recreation department, library, visit-int room, school rooms well-fare and cashier department show and barber shops, sign painters, supply depot, mess



buses, office tables, files, repair work, etc., and etc. A personnel of 27 carpenters composed of 22 Issei and 5 Nisei with Kay Toramura, supervisor and Mr. Mori, hd. carpenter, have worked continuously since arrival. Beginning with a single modest office, they have expanded to 3 shops and a paint department. Excellent work has been produced by the hard working carpenters, ranging from large projects to small, meticulous work. Their jobs consist not only of construction alone, but of repair and upkeep.

The paint work consists mainly of varnish and shellack finishing. Approximately 100 gallons have been used so far.
