FLAMES SPREAD OVER WIDE AREA Fanned by strong, almost galo-like wind a fire of undisclosed origin swept over an estimated 2,000 acros of sage and brush a mile southwest of the center Sunday afternoon and periled the Reynolds form and reach house before the level fire erow aided by volunteers from the center brought it under control.

WIND SHIFTS
