EDITORIAL -: RIGHTS of the MAJORITY

One indefensible characteristic of the Japanesess their attitude toward community government. More specifically, in block affairs the residents do not cooperate fully, yet criticize the responsible officials for

their actions.

The right of free speech and criticism from the poople is the essence of a democratic government. This fact the Japanese have gribled evidently into a presumtion that they need not participate in local government and still retain the right to question the actions of those who have worked for the common velfare.

Even had the participation been 100 per cent, it is vital that rights of the majority be observed. It is only logical that the action of a majority is usually for the common interest. Yet, many Japanese, whose ideas do not coincide with the majority, do not accept the decision. They are the ones who reason that, because they differ from the rest of the world, the rest

of the world must be wrong.

The people is the foundation of a democratic system; without their initiative the system will not flourish. We must remember that the type of government in Lanzanar is democratic. A democratic system has been granted us where we could quite plausibly have had to bear, without argument, an autocracy.

The tall Bol Aire quintets load by Kaz Hara's 15 points scored a 36-52 victory over the Sears in Tuesday night's second encounter.


