## War Bred Suspicion

(Following is an article from the Milwaukee Journal—March 11, 1944 on brave Yanks with yellow skins and another entitled—"A Good Japanese" contained in the February 23 issue of the Republic Times (Ottawa, Ill.) Ed Note)

Before using some wartime adjective in front of the noun "Jap," read the story of Sgt. Gary Hisaoka, of the American army in Italy. Read how he rescued his white major from under the very muzzles of the German guns. Or remember the modest way in which Mike Miyake, another Japanese American from Hawaii, passed off commendation of his bravery in bringing wounded men out of Cassino. A couple of months ago dispatches from Algiers told of the Japanese American surgeon who labored on and on, without relief, to care for our wounded in spite of his four broken ribs.

Wisconsin has reason to have more than ordinary interest in the outstanding record that is being made by these Japanese in American uniforms, for many of them were trained in this state only about a year ago.

Wisconsin will hope, as the men themselves hope, that the bravery and utter devotion to America of these Japanese Americans will convince the rest of us that a man should be judged on his character and his accomplishment and not on his ancestry, the slant of his eyes or the color of his skin.

No better antidote could be compounded for the potent poisons of war bred suspicion and racial hatreds.

### A GOOD JAPANESE

Ben Kuroki is a Japanese American who has twice won the distinguished Flying Cross for his bombing work in Europe. His present ambition is to bombard Tokyo.

Kuroki is proof that not all Japanese are like Tojo and Co., and that Japanese blood is not a curse which inexplicably dooms its possessor to damnation. Kuroki deserves a place beside the many good Americans, from Generals down, who are of German blood.

## Raise Postal Rates; Fees To Be Effective Here March 26

New postal rates and fees, effective March 26, upped all first class local zone mails from two to three cents per ounce or fraction thereof, alongside other reported changes, announced Superintendent Gillus McPhee of the Manzanar Post Office.

Other postal rate changes were to Armed Forces overseas—6

cents per half ounce or fraction thereof.

Parcel post—The postage on all mail matter of the fourth class is increased 3 per centum, fractions of one-half cent or more being computed as 1 cent, but in no case shall the increase per parcel be less than 1 cent.

War time brings many changes in the sports field as in others. Because the physically fits are engaged in a larger battle, the younger sport-minded are having a rare opportunity to show their talents in many of the high-ranking sport scopes. Young "kids" are being snatched out of high schools and employed to play baseball—so young some of them just got into their first long trousers. This war time boom certainly opened the fields to the younger generation never to be had again in a long time.

## NISEI IN MANY SPORTS

This war time boom brought out the niseis in many sport realms. In the middle-west, a Dick Miyagawa, University of Wisconsin star leatherweight boxer is making headline sports news. It is reported that the former San Jose College star and 127 NCAA king recently scored a technical knockout over Frank Serrago of Pennsylvania State in one minute 23 seconds of the second round as the U. of Wisconsin defeated the Penn lads before 6,000 fans at the Wisconsin field house.

## Lancers In Forth Win; Timbers Victim

The strong Island Lancer quintet marked another win to their victory column after engaging the Timbers in a basketball pot-pourri and coming out on the better end of a 34-26 score. This triumph registered the fourth straight subdual for the Lancers.

Lancers' Nori Iwasaki hooped two successive shots aided by everyone of his mates to put a 14-2 noose on the Timbers in the first quarter. Both outfits played a speedy fracas in the first quarter employing zone defense.

Substituting freely, Lancers were held to 6 points in the second quarter while Timber Min Kosaka, Joe Fukushima and Yoshi Ostuka looped the ring to trail, 22-8 at intermission time.

Lancer Fukuda copped scoring high for the fourth time with 14 to register 58 to date.

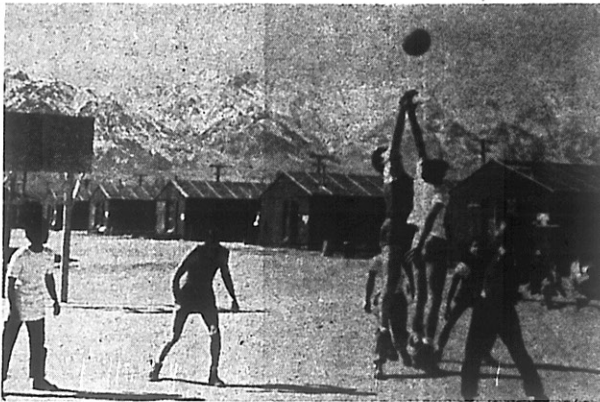

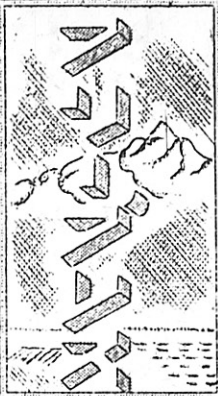
