## ARMY DOCTORS TO BEGIN EXAMINATIONS HERE TODAY

Army physical examination team, composed of six men, was scheduled to be in Manzanar last night, and examinations will begin today at 8 a.m., according to Project Director Ralph P. Merritt. He added that it will require four days to complete the medicals for the 130 men who have received notices in this center.

Chief Medical Officer W. Morse Little stated that the hospital staff would assist the army doctors in any way called upon, but as of this writing, he had not received specific instructions outside of the already completed blood tests and X-rays.

## NISEI EXPATRIATES SUBJECT TO DRAFT

Nisei expatriates are subject to the selective service act of this country since they are American citizens, stated local Employment Officer Arthur M. Miller this week.

In clarifying the statement carried in the Poston Chronicle stating that persons registered previously for expatriation shall be inducted if physically qualified and not otherwise deferred, Miller said, "No matter if they have signed for expatriation, they are still American citizens and are thus subject to the selective service act, and if they do not accept induction willingly, they will be sent to federal prisons."

### NULLIFIES RULING

This nullifies the previous ruling which stated that applicants for expatriation subsequent to January 20, the date of on which nisei draft was instituted would be considered draft evaders.

## INSTRUCTIONS BAN PRIVATE ENTERPRISES

Administrative instructions from Washington to the effect that all personal services must be carried on through the cooperative enterprises, effective May 1st, was revealed by Frank Yasuda, secretary of the co-op board of directors.

He stated that this would mean those who are currently employed by the canteen staff in the capacity of domestic help would hereafter be paid by the co-op at the standard WRA wage scale. The fee for the services would then be made payable directly to the treasury of the co-op.

## LOCAL 319TH M.P. COMPANY REPLACED

Project Director Ralph P. Merritt disclosed to block managers Friday that as of April 20, the 319th Escort Guard Company had been replaced by the 1999 Service Command Unit. The new unit, a smaller group than the former company, is still under the command of Capt. Edward Fackler.

Between 2000 to 2500 residents of Jerome will be sent to Gila River domestic during the latter part of June, according to Hugo Wolter, assistant project director of Gila, Ariz.

## ANNOUNCE RE-OPENING OF SHIPPING TO NISEI

With the setting up of a new procedure in Washington under the jurisdiction of the U.S. Coast Guard, the maritime unions of the East Coast announced the re-opening of shipping to the nisei members, according to a teletype received by Project Director Ralph P. Merritt this week.

### PROCEDURE

The procedure was worked out by all government agencies interested in the utilization of the skills of American seamen of Japanese ancestry in the U.S. merchant marine.

### APPLICATION BLANKS

Application blanks will be forwarded to the project directors as soon as they can be reproduced. Neither Coast Guard nor War Shipping Administration will consider inexperienced persons under 26 for maritime employment, teletype concluded.

Another of the great war plants in the northern industrial area was opened to nisei without prior Provost Marshal clearance recently when the Federated Metals Division of the American Smelting and Refining Company of Chicago, Indiana, was approved by the army.

Harry C. Cullop, superintendent of the plant, and Sam Thomas, president of the C.I.O. union in the plant gave strong assurance of a ready welcome for Japanese Americans, and help in arranging housing will be given them.

## PARENTAL INFLUENCE

As this is written, medical examination is being given to almost two hundred young men on the project by the army medical team. The test of obedience to the call-to-arms by our country confronts these young men and all others who are to follow them. The present policy of the selective service program calls for early induction of the men of Manzanar between the ages of 18 to 26. Those who are nearer 18 than 26, it may be presumed, will bear more parental influence in their decision than those who are older.

The good influence, or the lack of good influence, which parents may convey to their sons will have a marked bearing on the attitude which their sons adopt and the subsequent induction into the Army of the United States. The effect of this influence cannot be over-estimated. Sound thought and judgment of the parents will affect the viewpoint of their sons in their daily associations with each other. Most of us already are aware of consequences confronting draft evaders in service of the projects. We hope that our young men in the first group of registrants will exemplify that standard of high courage and determination.

The consequences of draft evasion, we can be assured, will not result in those evaders being sent to Tule Lake Segregation Center. All contrary rumors and viewpoints notwithstanding, this may be regarded as a certainty.

## OUR PLEASURES

Those of us who feel that we will be staying here for an indefinite period due to personal circumstances, or conveniences, always have wanted improvements in the daily conveniences afforded to us by the WRA.

We want roomier apartments. We want plentiful supplies of mops, brooms, soaps and other necessities. We want a swimming pool for our youngsters. We want permission to take hiking trips to the foot of the Sierras. So long as this area remains within the zone of strategic military area, we will not be granted the last privilege. Other phases of these conveniences cannot be established immediately by the authority.

We may be certain that the project director and the administrative personnel are aware of these desires on our part.

Evidences of impatience on our part will not expedite these requests. We have been here two years. It is not unreasonable to expect that most of us should have, as the boys would say, "wised up", by now.

Request for these conveniences, couched in terms of complaints and bickering, we may be assured, is not a persuasive method.

Five girls were selected as winners. Winners were announced by the five officiating judges as follows:

Toriko Yonai brought top honors to beauty operator Fuji Kajihara; Kayoko Munoki drew second place for Fumiko Nakagawa; Masako Kimura placed third for Masako Yotsukura; Hideko Matsuno placed for Kazuko Murakami; Masako Matsuo's Jane Tani placed fifth.

Decorator Harumi Kido assisted in making this contest what residents lauded as "a grand success."

## Two Residents Under Arrest

Two persons were placed under technical arrest, when they were caught building a cellar, stated Chief of Internal Security, John M. Gilkey.

"Some unthoughtful residents have persisted in the building of new cellars which is an outright violation to a proclamation issued by Project Director Ralph P. Merritt, and if caught will be placed under arrest," he said.

A statement issued July 2, 1943 by Mr. Merritt, forbids the digging of more basements, and in making of previously built basements safe and sanitary, Chief Gilkey disclosed. This statement was issued for the benefit of the residents, as there are many things such as cave-ins, water seepage, and unsanitary conditions which endanger the lives of the residents, he declared.

## Outdoor Movie Receipts Revealed

Manzanar Cooperative Enterprises' box office receipts at the outdoor movie program for the period from March 24 to April 22, totaled \$511.95.

It was revealed that the grand total amounted to \$1379.35 to bring the movie schedule back to free admission. Balance payable to the baseball teams participating in the last winter league was \$1452.15.

Sokichi Sugimoto, general manager of the Co-op, stated that the San Fernando Aces withdrew their claim of \$115.29 against the CACA which brought the total down to \$1336.86. Excess of \$42.49 will be kept by the Community Activities Cooperative Association.

The program will take place at 1:45 p.m. between buildings 7-7 and 7-15. Exhibits of high school work will be on display both in the classrooms and in 8-15 during the week.

## Arrest Man for Making Sake

Iso Hori, 4-13-1, was arrested last Thursday afternoon, when he was caught manufacturing sake illegally, disclosed Chief of Internal Security John M. Gilkey.

The sake and mash with equipment and numerous jugs were located in the back of a false work in the basement, Chief Gilkey stated. Hori is now at Manzanar Internal Security Headquarters awaiting action by federal authorities.

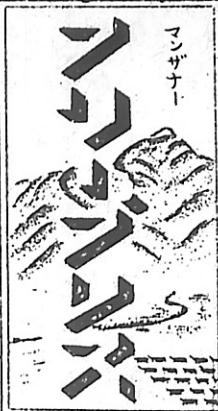
