SUPREME COURT RULES ON NEGRO ISSUES

WASHINGTON, May 17.—The Supreme Court recently refused to budge from its stand that Negroes have a right to vote in Texas Democratic primary elections, stated the Los Angeles Times.

Without comment the court declined to reconsider its 8-to-1 decision of April 3 that a man cannot be barred from participating in the selection of "his rulers" because of his color.

The court also cleared the way for broad consideration of the problem of Japanese American citizens who were removed from the West Coast and sent to detention camps under military orders shortly after the outbreak of the war. It agreed to hear the appeal of Hitsujo Endo of Sacramento, Calif., for release from a war relocation authority camp in Modoc County, Calif.

Arguments of her appeal will be heard next fall, along with another case challenging the constitutionality of the evacuation orders. The latter case was filed by Fred Toyosaburo Korematsu, taken from San Leandro, Calif., to a WRA center at Topaz, Utah.

INDICT THREE NISEI ON TREASON CHARGES

WASHINGTON, May 17.—Attorney General Francis Biddle recently announced the indictment in Denver of three American born sisters of Japanese ancestry on charges of treason in connection with aiding the escape of two German prisoners of war from a camp at Trinidad, Colo., last October, disclosed the Daily News.

The indictment, Biddle said alleged that the women—Tsuruko Wallace, Florence Shizue Otani and Billie Shitara Tanigoshi—furnished money, clothing, food, road maps and transportation to the prisoners, Heinrich Haider and August Doescher, who were quickly captured.

REQUEST EVACUEES' REPORT ON FOREIGN INVESTMENTS

Residents having foreign bonds, securities, bank deposits or properties, are asked to contact the Project Attorney's Office at once about filing a report on Treasury Department Form TFR-500, according to Evacuee Property Officer D. S. Bromley.

"Any person otherwise required to report is exempt if his foreign property on May 31, 1943 had a total value of less than \$10,000, measured by 'cost of face value' or 'market or estimated value' whichever is higher; but the exemption does not apply to foreign bonds payable in United States dollars, which must be reported regardless of value", he said.

Bromley asked residents not to confuse Form TFR-500 with Form TFR-300, which many persons filed about two years ago.

"Filing of a report on Form TFR-300 does not excuse anyone from filing a report on Form TFR-500," he declared.

INTRODUCE BILL TO DEPORT JAPANESE

WASHINGTON, May 17.—A bill calling for the deportation of all Japanese aliens immediately following the end of the war was introduced in the House today by Representative Mott (Republican), Oregon, who declared that Americans no longer wish Japanese subjects "to disgrace our soil."

Mott's measure would issue deportation warrants against all Japanese undesirable aliens within 30 days after the end of hostilities.

Action is imperative now, Mott added, lest postwar propaganda based on the argument that the Japs are "no longer our enemies" defeat its approval following the conflict.

FINANCIAL AID OFFERED EVACUEES BY RFC

TOPAZ, Utah—Evacuees who wish to reenter business may receive financial aid from the Reconstruction Finance Corporation lending program, which is designated to aid small business enterprises, the Topaz Times reported here recently.

Applications for loans to establish or re-establish small businesses will be considered from any type of business enterprises, including corporations, partnerships or individual businesses.

No loans will be made for the purchasing of farm real estate, newspapers or liquor manufacturing or dispensing firms.

As security a first mortgage or real estate, the plant and equipment, or a first mortgage of chattels, or an assignment of accounts received are requested by the RFC. All loans mature in five years and are amortized on a monthly basis.

80 SEGREGATEDS ARRIVE AT TULE LAKE CENTER

TULE LAKE, Calif., May 17.—Arrival of 80 Japanese from the Minidoka Relocation Center, near Twin Falls, Ida., today brought the total of segregated Japanese at the Tule Lake Center to the 17,000 mark.

The 80 new arrivals had been designated as sympathetic to Japan by the war relocation authority.

"I send this resolution to you, because I think that the people of Manzanar should know that there are some people who do not agree with our native racists, whose opinions are so loudly expressed.
