LAST WFA FURLOUGH GROUP DEPARTS JUNE 21 FOR OREGON

Last furlough group under the sponsorship of the WFA is slated to leave here June 21, for Ontario, Ore., and vicinity. Persons planning to leave with this last group must sign up by the deadline which is June 16, the Relocation Office disclosed.

In addition to regular adult recruitment, boys 17 years of age may now go on furlough to join relatives already there, or if they have their parents consent, it announced. Seasonal contracts for these school age youths will expire on August 23, it announced.

Those interested see Mr. Gerold Ramsey, WFA recruiter at once.

SUMMER MUSIC CLASSES TO START SOON

Boys and girls of elementary and high school age who wish to take music lessons during the summer months, are urged to register this week at the Music Hall, 24-15, stated Mrs. Aksel Nielsen.

Mrs. Nielsen revealed that since the place and staff is limited, those who wait to sign up after this week may not be able to get into a class.

Although every student is expected to furnish his own instrument (with the exception of the piano), Mrs. Nielsen disclosed that bugles, drums, a baritone horn, a bass horn and a tuba are available free of charge at the hall. There are a few second hand instruments for sale.

"Persons with musical interests are advised to avail themselves of this unusual opportunity to study music at Manzanar," Mrs. Nielsen stated.

MARCH ON ROME G.I.s PIC.U. BY W.F. THIES

With the Fifth Army's recent march on Rome, the *New York Times*, in its June 7 issue, carried a three column 6 inch U. S. Army Signal Corps radiotelephoto which pictured a single column of Japanese Americans on the march into Rome.

Although none of the soldiers were identified, the caption accompanying the picture read: "They played a notable role in the offensive."

FORBID PERSONAL USE OF GOVERNMENT VEHICLES

"Use of government-owned vehicles for personal use is prohibited by law and the comptroller general has ruled that the transportation of employees from their homes to their places of business is their personal responsibility, and therefore, that government-owned vehicles may not be used for this purpose," according to Project Director Ralph P. Merritt.

EMPLOYEES
He said that in order that employees living off the center may make arrangements with the ration board for additional gasoline, and with other employees for car pools, he will delay putting this regulation into effect until Monday, June 19.

26-37 AGE GROUP SUBJECT TO DRAFT

POSTON, Ariz.— Possibility of induction of men between the ages of 26 and 37 residing in WFA centers was voiced here from selective service boards in Salinas, Watsonville and Sacramento in California, according to the Poston Chronicle.

It was stated that, if relocated, men in the 25 to 29 age group in essential work and those in the 30 to 38 group may apply for deferment.

The Salinas local board No. 120 wired Poston as follows:

"This board contemplates processing for induction and inducting all Japanese American registrants physically qualified in age group 26 through 37 presently residing in relocation centers. This is in conformity with our state headquarters bulletin No. 180."

CHARGE LAND SUIT AGAINST TWO NISEI

STOCKTON, Calif.—Charging that two pieces of San Joaquin county land registered in the name of American-born Japanese was in reality owned and used by aliens, Attorney General Robert W. Kenny of California and District Attorney C. E. Watson of Stockton filed suit recently to have the property forfeited to the state.

The suit, one of several such filed by Kenny, was entered in Stockton against Kiyoshi Watanabe and Terumitsu Akita, Nisei.

Their ownership, the suit contends, "is merely subterfuge and cover for the transactions of alien Japanese who were the real owners" and received profits from the crops.

WHOSE FAULT

In an over-zealous attempt to condemn the recent housing program initiated by Mayor Brown, the Bronzeville Record, a negro publication in Lill Tokyo writes:

"We will wager that Hitler didn't look for the best spots in those Ghettos, just as our mayor didn't look for the clean places in this little city to command. Clean places that these people have made clean. Places that rock with Japanese filth, the so clean sons of heaven left for Americans to clean up. Filth that these Americans have cleaned up and who are proud of the result."

If the editor of this weekly publication is speaking earnest and is under the impression that the Japanese were so filthy, he has been grossly misled. He does not realize that his people entered apartments and residences that were vacated in a hurry, in a manner that can be understood only by evacuees. Apparently without cognizance of the sweat and tears that were involved in the Japanese evacuation, the negro weekly on which front page all but one minor story deal with murders, makes a blanket accusal of the Japanese reeking with filth.

The city is providing them with new sanitary homes, a procedure not deemed necessary while the Japanese were there. The negroes admonish the mayor for helping them; furthermore they blame their own living conditions on the evacuees. If it had been the negroes instead of the Japanese who were forced to evacuate on mass on such short notice, we wonder in what sort of condition they would have left those buildings.

HEMP INDUSTRIES OFFER EMPLOYMENT

Hemp industries operating 42 mills in small towns located in Illinois, Iowa, Wisconsin and Minnesota plan to recruit a number of workers for these mills on year-round employment, stated Relocation Program Officer Walter A. Heath.

"All of the mills are located in rich agricultural area which offer excellent permanent farm relocation possibilities," he declared.

Housing is being developed in each community by the War Hemp Industry.

Jobs in these mills pay from 60 to 75 cents plus some overtime. Men and women of all ages will be

employed. This is also an opportunity for both family groups and for individuals, according to Heath.

TRANSPORTATION

"No government-owned cars will, after June 17, be used for transportation of employees to Lone Pine or Independence. Employees desiring housing in the center should apply to the office of E. H. Hooper, assistant project director," he concluded.

TRIAL LEAVE POPULAR AMONG OLDER EVACUEES

"Trial leave has proven popular particularly among the older people", announced Walter Heath of the relocation office this week.

Heath explained that trial leave, as the name implies, permits a person to try indefinite leave before indefinitely committing himself. After four months and before the end of the sixth month, he can return to the relocation center if he so desires. Persons who convert to indefinite leave immediately become eligible for all financial benefits they would have otherwise received.

NEED SUPERVISOR ST. LOUIS FACTOR

A factory supervi or is needed in St. Louis, Mo. to take over management of a small factory manufacturing plaster figures such as book ends, religious statuary, millinery heads and jewelry busts, according to Assistant Relocation Program Officer Walter A. Heath.

"A person who has a draft deferment and is between the age of 25 and 45 and who has had experience supervising other people will be considered," he said.
