PRROPOSAL ON MANZANAR WILL REGEIVE. 'DUE CONSIDERATION'

Seinator Hirem Johnson of California, in a letter to Wt. Thitney Post io. 265 of southern Inyo, disclosod that the proposal of converting :ianzanar Relocation Center into $a$ veteran's rehabilitation center "wilil be duly considered in the near future by the Voteran's adninistration in Vashington", tho Iituo Inciopendent said.

In a letter to Senator Johnson, Frank T. Hines, administrator of the Ve toran's daministration, concerning the proposal, declared:
"1/1ith reference to utilizing the Bianzanar facilities nentioned in your l.etter for hospital purposes, you are advised that immediately following the pessage of the Servicemen's Readjustment ict a recommendation was made to the Federal Board of Hospitalization for the establishment of a nev Veteran's ddministration facility in the State of California. is yet a definite location has not been selected. Inasmuch es facilities now operated by other Federal agencies will be given consideration prior to making a finel selection, you may be assured that the advantages of the (Manzanar) lacilities referred to Soove vill receive careful consideration."

The reply is one of sevoral received by sit. Whitney post members concerning their proposal to make danzenar e Veteran!s facility.

RELEASE FACTS ON FISEI BATTALION

Jepanese dinerican 100th Infentry Battalion, which recently received a citation from Iicutenant General lark \#. Clark, U, S. Army, Commanding General of the Fifth Arry, has participated in fighting on virtually every front es-. tablishod in the drive through Italy, reports from Fifth Army Headquarters indicate.
FIGHT ACROSS VOLPURHO
Going into action first in the Naples area, the battalion fought its way across the Volturno River and the Rapido Aiver, and was in the front lines for 40 days at Cassino. Later it vas transferred to the beachhead at Anzio and took part in the breal through to Rome.
ACCOMPLISHED IN JUNE
Mission for which the battalion was cifted was accomplished June 26 and 27 in the vicinity of Belvedere and Sassette, Italy. A strong Germain conter of resistance domineted a vital highvay and impeded the advance of an American infantry division, In tho face of numerically superior forces of Jazi infentry and field artillery, the battalion fought its vay to the defended posi-. tions and completely destroyed the eneqy flank position, killing 178 Gor-. mens, vounding 20 , and capturing 73 in the process.

Nator conservation now means a safeguard against weh fires; also as an eid to firo-fighting, lator. The hot and dry season for thia valley is not yet over. Full cooperation of all to the rulings set forth in the directoris orders should be obeyed.
