PROPOSAL ON MANZANAR WILL RECEIVE 'DUE CONSIDERATION'

Senator Hiram Johnson of California, in a letter to Mt. Whitney Post No. 265 of southern Inyo, disclosed that the proposal of converting Manzanar Relocation Center into a veteran's rehabilitation center "will be duly considered in the near future by the Veteran's administration in Washington", the Inyo Independent said.

In a letter to Senator Johnson, Frank T. Hines, administrator of the Veteran's Administration, concerning the proposal, declared:

"With reference to utilizing the Manzanar facilities mentioned in your letter for hospital purposes, you are advised that immediately following the passage of the Servicemen's Readjustment Act a recommendation was made to the Federal Board of Hospitalization for the establishment of a new Veteran's Administration facility in the State of California. As yet a definite location has not been selected. Inasmuch as facilities now operated by other Federal agencies will be given consideration prior to making a final selection, you may be assured that the advantages of the (Manzanar) facilities referred to above will receive careful consideration."

The reply is one of several received by Mt. Whitney post members concerning their proposal to make Manzanar a Veteran's facility.

INYO BUSINESSMEN MEET TO DISCUSS MANZANAR

Establishment of a servicemen's rehabilitation center here, whenever the present use of the project as a relocation center is discontinued, was proposed last week by the Independence Business and Professional Men's club, according to the Inyo Independent.

REGULATIONS ON WATER USE RELEASED BY MERRITT

Commencing this week, irrigation of gardens and the watering of lawns within the center area will be prohibited between 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. on week days until further notice, an announcement from Project Director Ralph P. Merritt disclosed.

Merritt asked that all residents cooperate with this ruling and in addition save as much water as possible where it is necessary to use water for domestic purposes.

"Water supply of Manzanar depends upon melting of snow packs in the high Sierra. At this season of the year, the hot afternoons melt the snow in the mountains and the run-off comes down our creeks during the night. The run-off in the daytime at this season of the year is so much reduced that all of the water must be saved for essential purposes," Merritt declared.

FIRE DEPARTMENT SEEKS MORE FIRE-FIGHTERS

Fire Department requests that all eligible unemployed men consider the positions now open for fire-fighters.

"We would regret any fires among the living quarters, and we must be ready to meet any emergency with adequate fire prevention personnel," the announcement declared.

RELEASE FACTS ON MISEI BATTALION

Japanese American 100th Infantry Battalion, which recently received a citation from Lieutenant General Mark W. Clark, U. S. Army, Commanding General of the Fifth Army, has participated in fighting on virtually every front established in the drive through Italy, reports from Fifth Army Headquarters indicate.

FIGHT ACROSS VOLTURNO

Going into action first in the Naples area, the battalion fought its way across the Volturno River and the Rapido River, and was in the front lines for 40 days at Cassino. Later it was transferred to the beachhead at Anzio and took part in the break through to Rome.

ACCOMPLISHED IN JUNE

Mission for which the battalion was cited was accomplished June 26 and 27 in the vicinity of Belvedere and Sassetta, Italy. A strong German center of resistance dominated a vital highway and impeded the advance of an American infantry division. In the face of numerically superior forces of Nazi infantry and field artillery, the battalion fought its way to the defended positions and completely destroyed the enemy flank position, killing 178 Germans, wounding 20, and capturing 73 in the process.

Since the majority of the people do not have the finances to attend trade schools, more vocational training courses should be offered in the center. Some jobs offer apprenticeship where one may learn the trade and earn enough to meet expenses.

EXPLOSION OCCURS AT SEWAGE PLANT

An explosion occurred at the local sewage plant early last week, according to an announcement from Project Director Ralph P. Merritt.

The project director declared that the explosion occurred when the butane gas which was being used, resumed operation after stopping for a short period. Merritt disclosed that no one was injured and that there were no acts of sabotage involved.

FOR SAFETY'S SAKE

Project Director's order issued recently regarding conservation of water means more than just saving water. The order prohibits irrigation of gardens and watering of lawns between 10 a.m. and 5 p.m.

The Poston relocation center in Arizona recently reached the danger point in the daily use of water. But until the seriousness of the situation was brought to the attention of the residents, the use of water kept increasing. Cooperation was asked and conservation of water demanded.

Residents of Manzanar have been rather fortunate in not having faced a situation such as the one at Poston. But that does not mean that we should get careless now.

One of the main reasons for such a measure being effected is that in case of fire, the fire trucks would have enough water at the hydrants when needed. The recent warehouse fires showed what could happen to barracks in the residential areas.

Water conservation now means a safeguard against such fires; also as an aid to fire-fighting, later. The hot and dry season for this valley is not yet over. Full cooperation of all to the rulings set forth in the director's orders should be obeyed.

NEW JOBS OBTAINED BY CHICAGO EVACUEES

CHICAGO, Aug. 16.—WRA officials announced that most of the 59 Japanese American workers involved in a strike threat on the Illinois Central Railroad three weeks ago had taken other jobs and that a few will return to the Heart Mountain Relocation Center near Cody, Wyo., where they were sent upon being evacuated from California.

JAIL LOCAL RESIDENT FOR DISTURBING PEACE

Police Chief J. W. Gilkey announced this week that James K. Kato, local resident, was taken to Inyo county jail in Independence on August 1 to serve a 45-day sentence for disturbing the peace.

RELEASE ESTIMATED COST OF RECENT FIRE DAMAGE

Damages of the recent warehouse fire on July 28 amounted to \$19,000 disclosed Edwin H. Hooper, assistant project director of administrative management and member of the survey board, investigating the fire.

He reported that no information was available on the extent of damages to personal tools of evacuee carpenters which were kept in the warehouses.

Accumulation of gases in the Bas-Mor which heated water for the digester at the sewage disposal plant exploded at 12:45 a.m. on August 9, stated Hooper. Extent of damage was not disclosed.

TWO NISEI SOLDIERS KILLED IN ACTION

Two Los Angeles members of the 442nd Japanese American infantry, Lieut. Kei Tanahashi and Cpl. Yoshihara Aoyama, have been killed in action on the Italian front, the War Department announced.

Lieutenant Tanahashi was graduated in 1939 from UCLA.

Corporal Aoyama was a graduate of Belmont High School and Indiana university.

FATHER HUGH LAVERY TO ARRIVE THIS WEEK

Father Hugh Lavery and Father John Callan, Maryknoll priests, will arrive here this week for a few days, according to the Manza-Knoll, a publication of the local Catholic Church.

Father Callan served in South China in 1931 to 1942 when he was repatriated on the Gripsholm, according to the Manza-Knoll. It also disclosed that the Father enlisted in the army and had been serving as chaplain in the South Pacific area until recently when his health caused him to be discharged.

Father John Healy, a Jesuit priest is also scheduled to visit this center soon to conduct a day's "retreat" for the girls.

WENDALL P. GEE TO HEAD WRA DETROIT OFFICE

CLEVELAND, Ohio, Aug. 16 --With the appointment of Wendell P. Gee to head the Detroit office of the war relocation authority, the Michigan staff has now been brought up to strength and is ready to function more effectively on a state-wide basis, Robert A. Cullum, supervisor of the great lakes area, announced here recently through a war relocation authority release.

Mr. Gee has had a varied background of experience in both government and education. For a period just preceding his employment by the WRA, he was Field Representative in the Civilian War Services branch of the Office of Civilian Defense with headquarters in Chicago, and before that, he was employed by the War Department in the preparation of instructional material for pre-induction military training.

INSTRUCTIONS ISSUED BY RAILWAY EXPRESS

Residents were asked not to address their packages to Newell, California since there are two such cities in the state and since the Railway Express does not maintain an office there, according to Yon Miyasaki who is in charge of the local Railway Express office.

Yon Miyasaki disclosed that several goods sent through the Railway Express have already been reported lost or strayed through this error and asked that residents address their packages instead to Tule Lake, California.

First major fire in the near two-year history of the Rohwer relocation center was reported recently, according to the Rohwer Outpost.

The blaze started from combustible material in the block 16 boiler room while residents were engaged in their feast about 6:30 p.m., the Outpost disclosed.

CONVICT THREE NISEI ON CONSPIRACY CHARGE

DENVER, Aug. 16--Three Japanese American sisters were found guilty by the Federal Court jury on a charge of conspiracy to commit treason in the escape plot of two German prisoners of war.

The verdict was received calmly by the three sisters who now face possible imprisonment up to two years or a fine up to \$10,000, or both.

Defendants were Tsurako "Tots" Wallace, Florence "Flo" Shizue Otani, and "Billie" Shitara Tanigoshi formerly of Inglewood and Terminal Island, Calif.

Heath revealed that in addition to the abundance of job opportunities, housing is also available in Buffalo as in other cities.

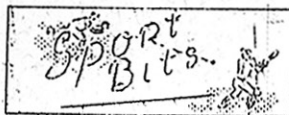
