TI: OF :AILIG: Christnas cards and parcels for personnel of the armed forces overseas must be mailed dring the period beginning September 15, 1944, and October 15, 1944. The War Department advises that Christnas greeting cards for soldiers overseas must be sent insealed envelopes and prepaid at the first-class rates.

Ho rea ests fron the addressees are required in comection with Christmas parcels mailed to army personnel curing this period only. Patrons should endorse each Eift parcel "Christmas Parcel". Specia). effort will be made

The farily couaselling prograii being carried on is a survey to see what and hov the people of Manzanar are feeling towards relocation．Although sone have shown a definite interest，others seen to want to stay here in the security of the ceater．Sone have resented the pro－ gram as a method of forcing theia to relocate．

## OPFORTIITIES GALORE

To wait till the end of this war to relocate is，we believe，very much of a nistake．Opportunities for eve－ cuees to resettle in midwest and eastern localities in all fields of enployment are many and varied．To ac－ cept those joos now nay help then in establishing ther selves in a postmar Anerica．Many out on seasonal leave no：have found erployment their liking and have made their decision to staying on the＂outside＂rather than returning to the confines of a relocation center：

Issei nore than ever should nake an effort to find out what job offers are to be had and should take steps to get back into the nornal strean of Anerican life． Qthers have done it，why couldn＇t you？

It is hoped that the various national organizations now working to stinulate relocation are successful，and that many who are nov content to stay in centers can be made to see that relocation is the thingo

Considerable vondernont vas caused anong the Inyo－ Kono residents this woek as the Los $A_{i n g e l o s ~ B o e v i d ~}^{\text {a }}$ of Public Works sought the ronstruction of six wells in San Fernando Valley， the Inyo $I_{n}$ dependent de－ clared．The Independent spid that residents wore wondering as to why water from this county must flow 300 miles to San Bernand Yelley to be＂eventually dumped ${ }^{n}$ into the Los Ange－ les River and＂flow into the ocean＂．Aind，in the neantine，＂sone of the rin chest fgricultural land in Gelifornia be allowed to reasin parched and non－pro luctive ${ }^{11}$ ．

The resolution to the Los

Angeles City Council by the Board of Public Works，ask－ ed for an appropriation of \＄30，400．
The wells would be placed at various points between Burbank City boundry and Sepulveda Blvd．，and a se－ venth well．，already drill－ ed by the Weter and Power Departi：ent be utilizedalso．

This nethod of reducing the ground water recently was recomended by a spe－ cial connittee appointed by Mayor Fletcher Bowron，and if it proves successful， the $b o_{a}$ rd will ask an addi－ tional allocation of $\$ 60,600$ to construct per－ nenont discharge lines fron the wells to the river， the Independent reported．

Seventy-five nore nisei draftees of Poston Relocation Center left recently for Fort Douglas, Utah where they will be inducted into the arred forces, according to the $\mathrm{Sa}_{\mathrm{a}}$ Francisco Chronicle.

The Chronicle reports that approxinately 12,000 nisei soldiers are now in various branches of the arciy and that nore than half of these are on foreign duty.

It also stated that thero are several hundred nisei girls in the WAC's and in the liurses' Corns, and that nore than 200 men are in the United States !erchant Marine.

The public is urged not to include food or clothing in gift parcels. Not riore than one Christmes parcel shall be accepted for nailing in any one week when sent by or on behalf of the sane person or concern to or for the same addressee.

PREPARATIOI: Ovils to the great distance this nail must be transported and the handling and any storage it nust mdergo, it is absolutely necessary that all articles be packed in boxes of netal, vood, solid fiberboand or strong gumned-paper tape or tiod with strong trine.

PERISHABLiA SATTER: Perishable natter vill not be accopted and the sendine of fragile articles is discouraged.
