## ISSUE REGULATIONS ON OVERSEA YULE GIFT MAILING

Christmas packages and cards for personnel of the armed forces overseas must be mailed during the period beginning September 15, 1944, and October 15, 1944, according to local postmaster G. McPhee.

He said that the weight and size of packages will be limited to 5 pounds or 15 inches in length or 36 inches in length and girth combined. Not more than one Christmas parcel shall be accepted for mailing in any one week when sent by or on behalf of the same person or concern to or for the same addresses.

**TIME OF MAILING:** Christmas cards and parcels for personnel of the armed forces overseas must be mailed during the period beginning September 15, 1944, and October 15, 1944. The War Department advises that Christmas greeting cards for soldiers overseas must be sent in sealed envelopes and prepaid at the first-class rates.

No requests from the addressees are required in connection with Christmas parcels mailed to army personnel during this period only. Patrons should endorse each gift parcel "Christmas Parcel". Special effort will be made

"The damaged plane was moved through Bishop street on a truck and taken to the Army Air Base", the Register said.

## STAR CLARENCE MUSE ON LOVE PINE VARIETY SHOW

A two-hour variety show, starring Clarence Muse, noted Negro actor and composer and Bill Sharples, veteran radio program conductor of Hollywood, was staged Saturday night at the Lone Pine High School auditorium, announced the Inyo Register.

### ADMISSION FREE

Admission to the event was free; however, a free-will offering was made during the show for the Lone Pine swimming pool project fund. The plunge is now three-quarters completed.

Muse, star of stage production, "Foggy and Bess", and "Green Pastures", which played in New York and throughout the nation, and the film "Huckleberry Finn", sang some of his own compositions, including "Sleepy Time Down South," and "When We Go Over the Hill", the Register stated.

Also included in the program were Negro spirituals and numbers from "Foggy and Bess", comedy, dialogue and variety numbers.

## MOUNTED PATROL OFFICER SUSTAINS MINOR INJURY

Henry Kano, mounted patrol officer, received treatment at the local hospital, following a minor injury which he sustained while patrolling the picnic area, announced Police Chief J. W. Gilkey.

With the appointment of Malcolm E. Pitts as assistant director of WRA in Washington, Charles F. Miller has been designated as acting relocation supervisor for the western plains area, revealed National War Relocation Authority Director Dillon S. Myer.

Myer said that no appointment of field assistant director will be made for the time being.

Nebraska has gained another native son in the way of Fumie Nishimura who is visiting Manzanar from Lincoln where she is attending a school of commerce, Assistant Relocation Program Officer Walter A. Heath stated this week.

"Miss Nishimura claims total acceptance in Lincoln and from her reports, Lincoln has the welcome mat out farther than the bigger cities," Heath declared.

### HUNT, IDA...

In a recent community-wide election, five of the seven councilmen were re-elected for a six-months term beginning September 1... ### NEWELL, CALIF...

### NISEI SILENCES ENEMY

WITH THE FIFTH ARMY, ITALY—In a day's fighting, Private First Class Robert W. Yasutake recently silenced three enemy machineguns, killed four Germans and wounded and captured seven others, the War Department announced this week.

### "FLAME OF BARBARY COAST" BEING MADE NEAR BISHOP

Shooting of the "Flame of Barbary Coast" by the Republic Studio, at Long Valley and Mammoth areas will be completed this week, announced the Inyo Independent.

### STARS WAYNE, DVORAK

For the past week, a company of 85 has been working on the picture which stars John Wayne and Ann Dvorak, supported by Joseph Schildkraut, Bill Frawley and Virginia Grey.

The picture is being directed by Philip Ford, unit director of the Republic Studio

Ford stated that the production is one of Republic's most ambitious and that production cost will run over a million dollars.

### RESIDE AT BISHOP

With the exception of five employees, the entire company is staying in Bishop at the various hotels and motor courts, with lunch being taken daily to the group on location. The production is expected to be released in mid-September, the Independent stated.

## NOW IS THE TIME

A steady increase in relocation and relocation consciousness can be seen among the residents of this center. Those nisei who have relocated months ago have established themselves and are now calling for their parents to join them on the outside.

The family counselling program being carried on is a survey to see what and how the people of Manzanar are feeling towards relocation. Although some have shown a definite interest, others seem to want to stay here in the security of the center. Some have resented the program as a method of forcing them to relocate.

### OPPORTUNITIES GALORE

To wait till the end of this war to relocate is, we believe, very much of a mistake. Opportunities for evacuees to resettle in midwest and eastern localities in all fields of employment are many and varied. To accept those jobs now may help them in establishing themselves in a post-war America. Many out on seasonal leave now have found employment their liking and have made their decision to staying on the "outside" rather than returning to the confines of a relocation center.

Issei more than ever should make an effort to find out what job offers are to be had and should take steps to get back into the normal stream of American life. Others have done it, why couldn't you?

It is hoped that the various national organizations now working to stimulate relocation are successful, and that many who are now content to stay in centers can be made to see that relocation is the thing.

## LOS ANGELES COUNTY TO GET INYO COUNTY WATER

Considerable wonderment was caused among the Inyo-Mono residents this week as the Los Angeles Board of Public Works sought the construction of six wells in San Fernando Valley, the Inyo Independent declared. The Independent said that residents were wondering as to why water from this county must flow 300 miles to San Fernando Valley to be "eventually dumped" into the Los Angeles River and "flow into the ocean". And, in the meantime, "some of the richest agricultural land in California be allowed to remain parched and non-productive".

The resolution to the Los

Angeles City Council by the Board of Public Works, asked for an appropriation of \$30,400.

The wells would be placed at various points between Burbank City boundary and Sepulveda Blvd., and a seventh well, already drilled by the Water and Power Department be utilized also.

This method of reducing the ground water recently was recommended by a special committee appointed by Mayor Fletcher Bowron, and if it proves successful, the board will ask an additional allocation of \$60,600 to construct permanent discharge lines from the wells to the river, the Independent reported.

**BIDDLE DECLARES COAST RETURN UNPREVENTABLE**

TACOMA, Wash., Aug. 23--Speaking on the West Coast Japanese problem, Atty. Gen. Francis A. Biddle declared this week that it was his personal opinion that Japanese American citizens cannot be prevented from returning to the coast after the war.

**POSTON INDUCTEES LEAVE FOR FORT DOUGLAS**

Seventy-five more nisei draftees of Poston Relocation Center left recently for Fort Douglas, Utah where they will be inducted into the armed forces, according to the San Francisco Chronicle.

The Chronicle reports that approximately 12,000 nisei soldiers are now in various branches of the army and that more than half of these are on foreign duty.

It also stated that there are several hundred nisei girls in the WAC's and in the Nurses' Corps, and that more than 200 men are in the United States Merchant Marine.

**MEN WANTED BY POLICE FOR MOUNTED PATROL**

Two young men are being sought as mounted patrols by the Police department, according to Police Chief J. W. Gilkey.

Applicants must know the horses and be able to ride them as well as to handle the frisky horses. They will work under Sgt. Joe Sakki, patrolling the area in the picnic grounds.

**FOUR NISEI SOLDIERS RESCUE THREE AMERICANS**

WITH THE FIFTH ARMY, ITALY--Attacking a German-held house near Belvedere, four company runners of the Japanese American 100th Infantry Battalion killed one German and wounded another, captured three prisoners, and rescued three American soldiers who had been held captive, the War Department disclosed this week.

**KOBASHIGAWA AWARDED DSC ROLE,** Aug. 23--Lieut. Yeiki Kobashigawa was awarded a DSC for heroism under fire by Undersecretary of War Robert C. Patterson, the San Francisco Chronicle revealed.

It stated that Lieut. Kobashigawa, with the aid of another soldier, was responsible for neutralizing four German machine gun nests, capturing six Nazis and killing at least another near Lanuvio.

The Chronicle declared that the undersecretary spent much of his time talking with members of the Japanese American 100th Battalion.

**MONO MACHANO TELLS OF MASSACHUSETTS RECEPTION**

Visiting Manzanar from Norton, Mass., Mono Magono now staying with her family at 6-11-5, reports an outstanding reception and advises people to relocate to Massachusetts.

Miss Magono is majoring in psychology at the College for Women in Norton and says that the students are "very nice" and that nisei were unknown to the town people.

As a subscriber to the Manzanar Free Press, she found that the people in Massachusetts were very much interested in Japanese after reading the paper. They were also impressed with the fact that she had worked on the Free Press.

She marveled at the distinct seasons in New England; to her Spring was wonderful. New England is "very pretty", she claims, and "just full of scenery."

Miss Magono will terminate her visit on September 6, and will return to Norton.

**KIINKO KISHI WEDDING TO POSTONITE DISCLOSED**

to effect delivery of all Christmas parcels mailed during the year end season.  
SIZE AND WEIGHT: Christmas parcels shall not exceed the present limits of 5 pounds in weight or 15 inches in length or 36 inches in length and girth combined. The public is urged not to include food or clothing in gift parcels. Not more than one Christmas parcel shall be accepted for mailing in any one week when sent by or on behalf of the same person or concern to or for the same addressee.

**PREPARATION:** Owing to the great distance this mail must be transported and the handling and any storage it must undergo, it is absolutely necessary that all articles be packed in boxes of metal, wood, solid fiberboard or strong gummed-paper tape or tied with strong twine.

**PERISHABLE MATTER:** Perishable matter will not be accepted and the sending of fragile articles is discouraged.

**PROHIBITED ARTICLES:** Intoxicants, inflammable materials, (including matches of all kinds and lighter fluids) and poisons or compositions which may kill or injure another, or damage the mails are unmailable.

**HOW TO ADDRESS:** Addressee must be legible in typewriting or ink.

The complete address should be shown on a sheet of paper on the inside of the parcel in order to permit identification of the address in the event the outer wrapping becomes torn, mutilated or destroyed in transit.

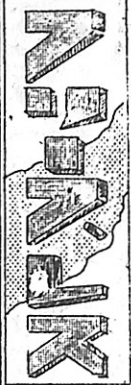
