Democracy Or Bigotry?

(Following editorial appeared in the Sunday World Herald of Kansas City, Mo., the heading, "No Room For Bigotry"—Editor).

"It's always open-season among certain of the populace on the West Coast to bait Japanese Americans—the loyal along with the disloyal.

"Hence, it was not surprising that this newspaper received the letter it did from H. J. M'Clatchy of San Francisco, who signed himself as executive secretary of the California Joint Immigration Committee.

"... the letter ... (proposed the) 'enactment of legislation canceling the American citizenship of all who claim its privileges, yet, under the dual citizenship theory, hold their first allegiance to an overseas government.'

"The proposal, on its face, appears to be one which all Americans could agree in principle. Certainly there is no room for dual loyalties under our democracy. Certainly it is a cardinal sin for Americans to hold their first allegiance to an overseas government.

"The Californian's proposal would, however, give the Nisei haters on the West Coast a handy brush with which to smear all Japanese Americans—loyal and disloyal alike. It would provide a further argument with which to bar from the Pacific coast a sizable group of American citizens who were slapped into concentration camps at the outbreak of war. That move may have been justifiable from a military viewpoint, but continuation of the ban after the war's end would be an entirely different matter.

"The best answer to the M'Clatchy proposal comes from Cassino, where the One Hundredth Infantry Battalion, composed of Japanese Americans, carved a permanent niche for itself in American military annals. Gen. Mark Clark, in conferring a distinguished unit citation on the battalion, said:

'Your record in battle has been marked by one outstanding achievement after another. You have written a brilliant chapter in the history of American fighting men.'

"The Battalion's soldiers hold one thousand Purple Heart decorations, 44 silver stars, 31 bronze stars, nine distinguished service crosses and three legion of merit medals. They won them fighting for the United States while the next of kin of many were held in relocation centers.

"Neither the West Coast nor the nation is big enough, Mr. M'Clatchy, to hold both democracy and bigotry. Let's give ALL loyal Americans a fair shake. Existing laws can deal adequately with the disloyal."

FACTS ABOUT Evacuee Property

(This is the second of a series of five articles dealing with the services and limitations of the evacuee property program.)

What about the sale of real estate? What information the evacuee gives the Property Office in order to get speedy action?

Full information concerning the property should always be provided by the evacuee. He must supply the exact location, geographically, as well as a legal description of the property involved, should state by whom the title is held and whether the owner is single or married. If the property is jointly owned by several persons, he must supply authorization for the sale from all of them.

The evacuee should supply full information about the amount of annual taxes of various sorts levied against the property, the amount and type of mortgage and the terms of the mortgage; the balance due on any type of lien or other encumbrance involving the property in question and the status of the title and whether or not a title insurance policy is held by the owner. The evacuee should also state whether fire or other types of insurance are carried and give full particulars including the name of the company, the amount and the expiration date.

Really Requirements

Most real estate sales are normally made through licensed real estate brokers, of course, and the brokers are entitled to a commission on sales. While the customary fee is 5 percent, the amount of the commission may vary in certain communities or localities.

Because of the Alien Land Law, title companies require a birth certificate from the owner if he is of Japanese ancestry and so each evacuee must supply (Continued on page four)

JAPANESE AMERICANS NOW FIGHTING IN FRANCE

American troops of Japanese ancestry, recently disclosed to be fighting as part of Lieut. Gen. Patch's Seventh Army, were believed to be in action in France.

Front line dispatches declared that the Seventh Army, fighting against the Germans on the western front, had mounted attacks east and southeast of Luneville on November 2. Advancing between the Meurthe and Vezouze rivers, the Seventh Army Yanks overran the towns of Fremelin and Ogeville on the railroad seven miles north of Baccarat, as well as Pettionville, five miles north of Baccarat.

ARMY AWARDS SILVER STAR TO HEROIC NISEI ON ITALIAN FRONT

WITH THE FIFTH ARMY IN ITALY—For gallant action in the Fifth Army Front in Italy, a Los Angeles, California infantryman of the Japanese American 442nd Regimental Combat Team, Corporal Yoshiharu N. Aoyama, recently was awarded the Silver Star posthumously. Although both his legs had been worn off when he went to the aid of a wounded companion, Aoyama refused medical attention and insisted that doctors attend to the other injured soldier first. He died a day after he was wounded.

The citation reads, in part: "Corporal Aoyama crawled through heavy mortar, artillery and machine gun fire to rescue an enemy forward observer who was wounded by shrapnel, rendering first aid to the injured artilleryman, Corporal Aoyama suffered a direct hit on his legs which were blown off at the knees. Corporal Aoyama attempted to render himself first aid and retained control of himself until reached by his platoon leader and a medical aid man.

"He was evacuated to an aid station under cover of darkness, and the aid men asked the more seriously wounded to speak up so they could be treated first and evacuated to the rear. When asked how he felt, Corporal Aoyama replied: 'I'm all right. The others need more help than I do. Treat them first.' He continually refused to accept aid until the others had been treated. Not until the medical aid men started to treat him was the extent of his injuries discovered. Corporal Aoyama died the next day.

"The extreme physical and moral courage of Corporal Aoyama and his concern for his fellow comrades when himself mortally wounded reflect the highest tradition of the military service."

Aoyama volunteered for service with the 442nd Combat Team, whose enlisted personnel is composed entirely of Americans of Japanese ancestry.

He sold fruit in Los Angeles, California before he and his family were removed from their home at 131 East Second Street, Los Angeles, and sent to the relocation center at Heart Mountain, Wyo. He studied chemistry for three years at University of California at Los Angeles.

one with his request for sale of real estate.

If the evacuee has a birth certificate, he should file the original or a certified copy with the request for sale. An evacuee who has no birth certificate can write for one to the recorder of the county in which he was born. The usual fee charged by the county is \$1. If the evacuee wishes the Property Office his date of birth, the name of the city and county in which he was born and the necessary fee.

Various communities have different customs with regard to title companies charges for the search. In all cases the seller pays for the recording of the release of a lien. It is customary for taxes, insurance and rentals to be prorated as of the date of sale of property.

If the property to be sold has been leased, a copy of the existing lease should be provided to the Property Office. If one is not available, the evacuee should supply information about the lease, including the name of the tenant, period of the lease, rate of rental, whether there are any special conditions and whether there is a cancellation clause in the lease.

Personal Property

Complete and accurate descriptions of personal property

to be sold, such as refrigerators, sewing machines, furniture, etc., must be given to the Property Office so that there will be no errors or misunderstandings. The evacuee should supply the location and name of the custodian of such property as well as information about storage charges and how they are to be paid. If the property to be sold is not completely paid for, the evacuee must inform the property office the amount owed and the name of the firm to which it is owed.

It is desirable that the evacuee place a reasonable price on the articles to be sold, or he may re-

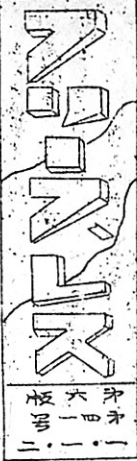
