## A GREAT AMERICAN

Cartoonist ！：ilion i．Griniff，after his recent comic drawing on＂Perry and the Pirates，＂deserve high praise and cossondation for his humanitarian action．

Unlike many other cartoonists who have cheaply re－ sorted to displaying discrimination by portraying dis－ torte pictures of the issei，this Times cartoonist re－ fused to be placed in the same category with them．

Comic lovers，who picked up the paper lately and saw Mr．Craiffis section，read where one of his comic subjects remarked：＂You have Japanese features，but I＇ve heard how loyal Americans of Japanese ancestry are working for the United Nations．＂

Today，as never before，what was once called Amer－ icon humor is now being flooded with what amounts to damaging propaganda．

Falsehoods and misrepresentation is not desired by the American public even if it is presented under the misleading nasa of comics．

Indecent reading matter places in jeopardy the normal mental growth of our children．

It places in the hands of these innocentominded children the vorlz of a hatemonger who seeks to imbed in the minds of future America the ungodly thought that we should hate our fellow Americansmand that＇s exactly what the Iii are．

But Mr．GOniff knows better．－
He must have heard of the heroic deeds of the famed Regimental Combat Team and the courageous actions of the 100，th Battalions．

But despite the widely－publicized news of the patriotic i．isei soldiers，a ilisei is reported to have been refused service at a barber shop in Parker，Colo．

It might be of interest to mention that this re－ jected iisei hobbled on a crutch－and he was wearing the uniform－of an American soldier．

Tho barber；who refused to accept him，denied that he shoved the $\mathrm{I}_{\mathrm{i}}$ sell from his premises or ousted him verbally from his shop．The II lei was standing out－． side the sidewalk when he was denied service，the bar－ Der claimed．

A grave injustice had been inflicted upon an Amer－ ian soldier tho＂es a ilisei．

Is it justified in refusing the Japanese Americans， who had already proved their loyalty，the rights and privileges they rightfully have earned？
