One-half of the center to be admitted on Saturday while the other half will be admitted on Sunday.

Plans are now being completed to have dinner hours advanced an hour earlier on these two nights.

Although the program is intended for the Issei, Nisei are also invited to attend.

ADVANCE MOVIE SCHEDULE FOR WEEKEND PROGRAM

Due to a special Manzanar Community Talent program on Saturday and Sunday, this week's movie, "Government Girl", starring Olivia de Havilland, Sonny Tufts and Anne Shirley plus Chapter ten of the "King of the Wild" will be shown to the residents tomorrow night and Friday, announced the Manzanar Club.

Admission both evenings will be by tickets only. Blocks 2 to 19 will be admitted tomorrow night. A matinee for children under 15 years of age is scheduled for Saturday at 2 p.m.

Residents, cleared by the army for return to the West Coast, may receive their notices sometime this or next week, disclosed Mrs. Emmy G. Haberle, who is in charge of issuing the documents.

She stated that she and her staff have checked about three-fourths of the clearance list to date and that they are trying to complete the entire list as soon as possible.

GRANT GIVEN TO STUDENT ON SCHOOL RELOCATION

Students are now eligible for relocation grants on the same basis as other residents provided that it is their final relocation plan, stated War Relocation Authority Director Dillon S. Myer in a telegram to the project.

The wire added that students will not be eligible to return to the center if grants are received by them. This new ruling became effective on the second of this month.

COMMUNITY ACTIVITIES WELFARE SECTION MOVE

Changes in the location of the Community Activities and the Welfare Sections were disclosed this week by the Administration.

The announcement stated that the Community Activities has moved from building 1-3 to building 1-12 while Mrs. Margaret D'illo's Clothing Allowance Section of the Community Welfare Department has moved from building 1-3 to building 1-9. Mrs. Dorothy Barth's Welfare Section has moved to building 1-3.

The purpose of these changes is to centralize the Welfare Sections into one building and to allow additional space to the Relocation Section since both of those departments are being expanded during the final phase of the WRA's program.

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Upon receiving the notices, residents may then apply for identification cards, showing that they are cleared.

These cards are not required and obtaining them is the responsibility of those who wish to have them.

To obtain the cards, the following procedure should be followed:

1. Obtain a request form by writing for it directly to the Commanding General, Western Defense Command, Presidio of San Francisco.

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MOTION TO HAN RETURN OF NISEI TO FORMER JOB

LOS ANGELES.—Recommending that no Japanese Americans be returned to county jobs until 90 days after the end of the war, Supervisor William A. Smith put a motion through the board of supervisors.

The supervisors said there was no legal barrier to the return of Japanese Americans, but Smith said "I think it is unfortunate if they press the matter and come back."

Only 22 were given leaves of absence at the time of their relocation, most of them employees of the General Hospital, the Los Angeles Daily News revealed early this week.
