## BROTHHR ABEIVES.

Ar. A. H . Alch, a brother living in $\mathrm{S}_{\mathrm{E}} \mathrm{I}$ Irancisco was notified of his sister ${ }^{1}$ s illness and left the bay city for :anemer, arriv. ing shortly efter his sister had died. Arrangements for the funeral services are not announced.

Ars. Al.ch joined the ivelfare Star: on april 2l, 1944 as Assistant Counselor where she had charge of the Genera? velfare throughout the canr, carried the responsibilities of clothing allowness and soldiers allotwents. In addition sho trained family visitors a:c acted as assistant to Krs. Dille.

Born in Komo Frovince, Russia and coming to this country as a. child her entire aduit lifewas devoted to helpins onners in the many piases oì velfore work which she folloved.

She wes a. Graciuate of St. Louis Jaiversity where she recsavei her L.L.B. HiThRS IAVY

Leaving the University Sirs. Alch followed law for a yeai and vith Vorld Var I entered the service of the Jited States Navy as Yeoman Ist Class.

During the yoars 1923 to 1926, Ns. A1ch continued her studies i:l Sociel Service vorleat the University of Califomia. Joining the Oalclead ..robation Office sho orgenizod, developed end conducted the Decertion ureas and dealt with the finencial and social probloms connected with broise: homes end deserted chi?.dren.

In 1929, tirs. Alch went abroad and stadied childvelfare woblems in Central -urozo. Sie was of-
fered an assignment with the United States Stete Departiment where she was placed in charge of Veterans' Administration vork in Karno, Lithuania. Here she remaincd until 1933.

Roturning to the united States irs, Alch accoptod an apointment as $\nu_{\text {istrict }}$ rield flepresentative with the Wast Vi=ginia Rolief Administration and supervised public velfare work in elevon counties. As exccutive officor of the district staif she ostablished local wolfaro boards and acted as a consultant in social vorle. Undor hor direction many local velfaro boerds wore established.

## PRaizirs CALIFORIIA

In 1935, :irs. Alch loft tho southern stato to follow similar work in Buffalo, Desiring to como to California, Ars. Alch accopted en assiennont as riold Reprosentative and area Director of the State Roliof Administration in San Fraicisco, supervising volfere officos in ton counties and functioning as a consultant in social worle and sup rvisine inservice training.
Proadening her experionce in the velfare field :'rs. aich resiened to become supervisor of Intake and Cortification with the Worle ?rojects Administration in San Francisco. Hore she supervised the activities of cese aidos and social wowters and maintainod working rclationships with tho public. Welfaro agoncies, the Stete Dopartment of mployment and the Comnunity Gost.

## II: RMLILF WORK

The Jowish Velfaro Fodoration offerod :irs. Alch an opportunity to superviso roliof work vith refugess from liazi controlled cobuntwios and sho rosignod from the VPA to accopt tho assignment with the privete agoncy.

In 1942, :irs. Alch wont to Dallas; Toxas as Social Sorvice Supervisor with tho City-County Volfaro dojartment and romained thure until shc cemo to Manzanar.
