## TO LIQUIDATE YOKOHAMA BAIK OF LOS ANGELES

A custodian was placed in charge of the Yokohama Specie Bank Limited, Los Angeles Branch, on January 12, 1942 by the state superintendent of banks. Project Attorney Alan G. Campbell disclosed.

He said that the banking superintendent says that he intends to place the bank in liquidation in the near future and that he will then call for claims to be filed by the depositors and other creditors of the bank.

Claim forms will be mailed to all depositors when they are ready.

All people who had deposits in the bank, or accounts with it, or any other kind of claims, e.g. inst. it, should advise the superintendent of banks of their

## MARCH 15 DEADLINE FOR FILING 1944 INCOME TAX

March 15 is the last day on which to file income tax returns for the year 1944, declared Project Attorney Alan G. Campbell in warning the residents of the deadline.

He stated that the Legal Aid Office, Building 1-2-3, has the necessary forms and will give assistance to evicted residents where it is needed, but he urged people who need help or want forms to "come in as soon as possible not wait until the deadline date."

"If very many people wait until the last few days, we cannot undertake to give them much help during a last minute rush," the project attorney said.

In general a return must be filed by everyone, including minors who had \$500 or more gross income in 1944. The return may be on form 1040, or withholding receipts may be used as a return if gross income was less than \$3000 and

## W-10000 TAX

(Don't from page one) consisted only of wages shown on withholding receipts and income of not more than \$100 of other wages, dividends and interest. If gross income exceeded \$500 and any part of it was from rents or profits or sales of property a formal return must be filed on Form 1040, and if any withholding receipt is missing Form 1040 must be used.

Anyone who had taxes withheld from his wages, but did not have wages or other income exceeding his exemptions must file a return either on Form 1040 or on his withholding receipts in order to obtain a refund of the taxes which were withheld. The exemptions are \$500 for

## BERKELEY R. CIVIL GROUP HOLDING FIVE BY FIVE FOR HOUSING AND JOBS

BERKELEY, Calif.—A community-wide survey of available housing for returning Japanese is being conducted by the Berkeley Inter-Racial Committee, the American Civil Liberties Union has disclosed.

It quoted the committee as declaring, "It is important for the welfare of the community, that returning Japanese-Americans neither be exploited nor placed in the position of depressing housing or wage standards." Jane Davis is the executive secretary of the committee and persons knowing of housing, temporary or permanent or employment even in part-time jobs, were asked to contact her at 2634 Le Conte Ave., Berkeley 4, Calif.

WARN ALIENS TO NOTIFY ON CHANGE OF ADDRESSES  
Center aliens are requested to notify the Department of Justice, Immigration and Naturalization Service, Alien Registration Division, Philadelphia, Penn., of their center addresses if they have not done so, the Immigration and Naturalization Service stated in a letter to Project Attorney Alvin G. Campbell.

It stated that this is the same card (Form AR-11) as those which aliens on the outside of relocation centers are required to use. These cards may be secured at the post office.

The announcement stated that it is necessary that every change of address be recorded, including a change of address to Sanzanar.
