NISEI WAG IN KENTUCKY MADE CHAPLAIN'S AIDE

FORT KNOX, Ky.—Fvt. Lilien Higashi, a Japanese American WAG, is now serving as a chaplain's assistant at Fort Knox, the Pacific Citizen revealed. She is the assistant to Post Chaplain Emil J. Holsoth, and counsels with men in trouble, serves as stenographer, drives the chaplain's car, projects motion pictures, and insists that she "likes people" and "loves her work." She was studying to be a language teacher when she decided to enlist into the WAG.

TERMINATE FURLOUGHS FOR FARM EMPLOYMENT

Seasonal leaves for agricultural employment, which was available to evacuee residents of the relocation centers, has been terminated as of January 3, 1945, according to the War Relocation Authority's Post-Exclusion Bulletin No. 5, issued from Washington. It stated that "agricultural workers in the centers will receive every encouragement to resettle in agricultural areas where there is adequate opportunity for them as agricultural workers or for other farm jobs as they may wish. This will be contingent upon there being housing facilities available for family living." The bulletin added, "although evacuees are free to make their own choice of the area to which they wish to go, recruitment centers and those they may wish to go, recruit-

WAR RELOCATION AUTHORITY ISSUES GRANTS TO HAWAII

Evacuees who wish to relocate to Hawaii are eligible for travel grants covering the ocean trip, the War Relocation Authority announced recently.

However, Relocation Program Officer Walter A. Hoath added that "although we have been and are paying transportation to Hawaii, I do not think that more than a half dozen people here will be approved for Hawaii."

According to the WRA ruling, a relocater may receive a grant to a West Coast point, work there until boat transportation is available, and then apply for another grant to cover the expense of the remaining trip.

A person following such plans should notify the center or field office that he is eligible for further grants covering the boat trip when he receives travel aid to the point of embarkation.

When the boat transportation becomes available, the evacuee may write to the office which issued the travel request for the additional grant.

SIX FORMER MANZANAR CALLED FOR INDUCTION

Six former Manzanar residents are among the 18 Inyo county youths to be called this week for induction into the armed forces of the United States, from Southern Service Board. The six are Bishop, according to an article appearing in the Inyo Independent. The six former residents called are Iwaki, Taro Arima, Kaji, Miko M. Nishio, Masayuki Okamura, Shigeo Sawamura and Hidoo Yokoniso.

SIXTY-FIVE PER CENT WILL WELCOME NISEI

BERKELEY, Calif.—Approximately 65 per cent of a representative group of university students interviewed in Berkeley would welcome evacuees of Japanese ancestry as members of their living groups, or aid in their return to the University of California campus, the Daily California reported recently.

Interviewed were 523 women, men, civilians, war veterans and servicemen.

OAKLAND JAPANESE GET THREATS BY TELEPHONE

SAN FRANCISCO—Oakland police are now investigating the mysterious telephone death threat to Ka-kuichi Sadamuro and his wife, Clara, who returned to Oakland recently from a relocation center in Arizona, the Utahippo revealed.

Sadamuro, former Oakland grocer, informed authorities the phone rang at 3:30 a.m. His wife picked up the receiver, and a man's voice said, "You and your husband are to get out of town or I'll cut your throat." The Sadamuros have three sons in the United States armed forces. They are Sgt. Alfred Sadamuro who was wounded in action in Germany; Pfc. Raymond and Pvt. Clarence Sadamuro.

Two messages from Japan are awaiting claimants at the Manzanar Red Cross Headquarters, Building 16-24.

Masaji Fujii has a message from Hyotaro Fujii of Wakayama-ken and Masu Fujishima has a message from Chiyoiko Obita of Kudanatsu, Yamaguchi-ken.

HAWAII GRANT

At the same time, Relocation Program Officer Walter A. Heath stated that Hawaiian evacuees who are eligible for travel grants may receive leave assistance to relocate to the Midwest or east and still be eligible for boat transportation at WRA expense when they are to return to Hawaii. He said that the trip must be made before March 1, 1945.

The evacuee will have to pay his own expenses from the place to which he has relocated to the point of embarkation.

Heath added, however, that applications to go to Hawaii must be approved by the army and that the army seems to be approving only persons who are residents of Hawaii and were on the mainland for a temporary period.

U.S. EMPLOYMENT OFFICE AIDS WEST COAST NISSEI

LOS ANGELES - Work has been provided for several Japanese-Americans returning to the Los Angeles area. Clayton von Dietz, office manager of the U.S. Employment Service in Los Angeles declared last week, according to the Pacific Citizen. "We have had no difficulty in placing the several Japanese who have come to our office," von Dietz said.

(Con't from pg. 1) ment for clearly seasonal work from which the evacuee may expect to return to the center's mill. He discouraged and the evacuee will be advised that he is ineligible to return to the center from such employment, the same as if he were accepting other permanent employment.

Since the War Department has rescinded the restrictions on eastern and southern sections, excludes desiring to relocate to these areas may now do so if they choose, the bulletin said.

It declares that they do not have to await official notification from the Western Defense Command and may relocate immediately upon applying at the relocation office.

Since the War Relocation Authority plans to close all centers by December 31, 1945, this would mean that approximately 60,000 people will have to relocate during the next eleven months.
