FIRE DEPARTMENT ISSUES RULES AND REGULATIONS ON CENTER FIRE HAZARDS

Acting Fire Protoction Officer Harloy Woodhouse this wook issued the following rules to residents of Manzamer in case of a fire:

1. Make sure you know where the nearest fire alarm box is located.

2. In cases of fire, turn in the alarm yourself or send someone to do it for you.

3. When you pick up the receiver, say "I wish to report a fire" giving as close a location of the fire as you can. This will aid the Fire Department in sotting up their equipmont.

4. Do not try to put the fire out yourself because that will delay the Fire Department in getting to the scone of fire in case they are needed.

5. Don't get excited.

PROJECT ATTORNEY GETS FACTS ON ALIEN PERMITS

Alions in the West Coast may travol to and from public officos, schools, churchos, homos and businessos without sccuring pormits from the Dopartment of Justice even though such routes may be outside the city limits, Project Attorney Alan G. Campbell was informed in a lotter from the United States Attorney's office in Los Angeles.

In instances where other frequent trips are necessary between communities which are outside the city limits, a blanket permit can be secured, allowing travel daily or at intervals without the n cessity of gotting separate permits for each trip.

No permits are necessary when aliens travel within a metropolitan area. The metropolitan area of Los Angelos includes San Fornando Valley to the north, and all of the coastal towns on the wort, southwest, and south, down to

YFARS OLD THRFF

Three years ago today. the Owens Valley Reception Center, now known as the Manzanar Relocation Center, came into existence with the arrival of 150 persons of Japanese ancostry who voluntarily ovacuated themselves from the West Coast. This was the first of the ten re-coption centers to be formed and was organized under the Wartime Civil Control Administration (the WCCA) of San Francisco as a part of the Western Defense Command agency under the command of Col. Karl -, Bendutson.

Feelings against persons of Japanese ancestry were high throughout the nation and particularly along the Wost Coast.

Hatred campaigns were noted throughout the West Coast and evacuoes themselves were uneasy.

Gradually, however, under the supervision of the War Relocation Authority which took over the control of the center on June 1, 1942, public rolations compaigns were begun.

Today, three years, since the memorable day, over 37,000 persons of Japaneso ancestry have been accepted on the outside and given equal rights. Chicago is reported to have received the most evacuass with a little over 7900.

Public sentiment along the West Coast is reported. more favorable than over" and with the lifting of bar. on persons of Capaness ancestry, approximately 180 over-cuess have been accepted in Salifornia 869 in Washington, 446 in Oragon, 1429 in Idaho and 130 in Newaday.

WITH 100TH BATTALION

WITH THE SIXTH ARMY GROUP, WRANCE -- Sgt. Robort Kiyoshi Ngkasaki, son of Mr. and Mrs. Fujito Nakasaki, 18-6-2, Manzanar, is a momber of the 100th Eattalion of the 442nd Infantry Regiment which is writing another thrilling chapter in its already massive book of courageous action, the Mar Department rovealed.

In a soctor of the formidable barrier that soparates France from Italy--250 miles of jegged mountain ridges and snow-capped peaks--this battalion is engaged in hazardeus mountain warfare,

The 100th gained a roputation as "the fightin est outfit" in Italy. In ono of the most sonsational actions of the Italian campaign, the battalion was ordered to wipe out a strongly-defended Gorman bastion, a small town north of Rome. In short time, it took the town, cut the main Gorman oscapo highway at three points, dostroyed the enemy's right flank, and forced a withdrawal over six stratogic Gormans killod. milos. wounded and captured totallod over 270. For this action, and consistontly outstanding combat oporation in Italy, tho battalion was awardod ' a War Dopartment Distinguished Unit Citation.
