## DISCLOSE DEADLINE ON USE OF WPA JTORAGE WAREHOUSES

All cvecuces other then oxcludoes, who heve proporty in storago at WRA werohousos shell bo requircd to romovo such proporty not lator than April 2, 1946, WRA Director Dillon S. Myor declared in the Post-Ixclusion Bullotin IIO. 7.
Although evacueos roturning to their proviously ovacuatcd arce shall bo roquirod to romove such proporty within 60 days aftor thoy return, Myor stated thet ovacucos who aro not proparod to rocoivo thoir proporty at tho end of tho 60 days bocausc of the lack of family housing, a socond move, or other porsonel circumstanco, thoy mey apply in vriting for an oxtonsion of that poriod by giving full justification. Such lettors should be addressod to tho eppropriate relocation area supervisor.

An edditional 90 day extension will then be granted if epproved with a maximum of 150 deys, if the facts warrent it.

Declering that "sovoral of us soldiors ${ }^{\text {II }}$ who had scon "e littile overseas sorvice in Italy and in Diorth Africe" had writton a. lettor to the Boc and that "our provious lotter uns not cloor so I angoing -o try axd clerify our statononts-Scluto To Bravo

Man", T/SEt. Waist said, "Boiling it dotm, wo havo scen nany young Japanoso at the battlofronts dying and giving a lot liko our buddics. Thoy heve givon and arc giving all thoy heve to dostroy tho onony. Thoy hevo gono ahoed whon wo vould havo turned beck. Thoy hevo a woyddorful fishting spirit and wo rom spect thon for thet. On ono occasion, Gonorel Mark Clarle gavo tho ontiro outfit a citation. This unit of non was fornod from Her wail and tho Wost Coast.

JAPANESE CFILDREN MAY ENTER . IDAHC SCHOOLS WITHOUT TUITION FEES

Japaneso femilies who have osteb].ished residence in Idaho aro duo all tho privilegos of the schools of the stato without tuition foos, Ieho Stato Attorney Gencral Brank Lengloy declarod in disclosing that thero is no objection to the Japanoso csteblishing residonce in tho stato.

Previously, in 1944, Lan gloy stated that tho Jepar nese peoplewore being placed in Idaho commatios by tho NRA and thet they wore still under the jurisaiction of tho WRA and woro not ontitled to ettord schools in Ideho without paying tuition. Howevor, only e. fow schcols appliod tho decision of the , attornoy genorel in 1944.

WITH THE SIXTH－ARSY， PRANC3－In some of the roughest fighting terrain in the Juropeen Theater of Operations，the Second Battalion of the 442nd In． fantry Ragiment－composed of Americani of Japanose ancestry，of thich Firat Sergeant Jac：－ $\mathrm{K}_{0}$ ．Vakamatsu。 son of tro and birs，Matsum nosuke Wai：amatsu who relo－ cated to Idaho last year from Janzaiar，is a member －is ongaged in front－line combat high in the Jrench Alps along the Francomitem 1ian border，the War Der partment disclosed．
HITH SIXTH ARGY
As part of It．Gen．Jacob I．Devers ${ }^{1}$ Sixth Arny Group，the battalion is sending out patrole into the mountain wilderness， and exploring enemy terrim tory for signs of troops movements anua voaknesses．

In the so－celled，＂Littio Cassinot line defending the approachos to the seam port of Leghorn，it fought over mountein heights so
impassable that ever mules could not be used to trans－ port supplies．Supply men tied themselves together with their own bolts as they heuled water，food， and ammunition to their fellow troops．The lessons it learned thon are paying off in the present Prencom Irelian border warfare。
Slugeing its way through Southern Prance into the Vosges Mountains，it play－ ed a great part in the resm cue of the nou famous＂Lost Battalion＂of this war．
Over 1，000 Purple Hearts， somewith Oak Leaf Clusters， have been avarded to Japar nese American troops． Fourteen $D_{\text {istinguished }}$ Ser． vice Crosses have been a－ warded or are pending； 54 Silver Stars， 51 Bronze Stars，and 79 division ci－ tations for individual mem bers．
Hifteen onlistedmon have won battiofield commiss－ iong，attesting to tho leadership of these mon in combat．
