## FIVE MANZANAR FAMILIES GET RESETTLEMENT AID

Five Manzanar. families, who relocated to Vale, Ore., have been accepted by the Vale Welfare Agency for resettlement essistance, according to a letter received recontly by the Manzanar Welfare Section from the relocation officer in Boise; Ide.

The amounts to be received by these families range from $\$ 90$ to - $\$ 385$. There irere from tivo to five members in oach family.

Most of the famil:?s needed house furnishings, such as bids, bedding, mattrecses, tables, chairs, cooking stoves; cooking utensils and silvorvare. They elso needed temporary finencial assistanco until they received their first salarios or bariod enough to be self-sppportine. In $2 l l$ of these casos the assistance roquested wes of a. temporary nature.
