

SIX REPORT FOR INDUCTION INTO RESERVE CORPS

Six boys, who had recently passed their pre-induction army physicals in Los Angeles, will report for induction into the Enlisted Reserve Corp at Fort McArthur in San Pedro, Calif., Thelma Kelleysig, supervisor of the Manzanar Selective Service matter reports.

The boys, Masami Henry Sato of 22-4-2; George Odahara of 14-11-3; Hiroshi Komai of 15-10-3; Mitsuo Nishizawa of 33-9-2; Tetsuo Yotsukura of 24-4-4 and Toshio Ralph Kikuta of 14-2-2, will leave the center bus at 9 p.m. on Monday, May 28.

This is the second group of boys to leave for ERIC induction at Fort McArthur since the lifting of the exclusion order earlier in the year.

The first group left for Fort McArthur on February 26, 1945 and consisted of 12 boys.

Manzanar Schools To End On May 29

Closing date for the Manzanar schools as well as schools in other centers was disclosed this week by National WRA Director Dillon S. Myer.

Elementary and secondary schools at the eight centers will end their final terms in the following order:

Minidoka (elementary), May 18; Rohwer, May 25; Heart Mt. May 25; Central Utah, June 1; Minidoka (secondary), June 1; Manzanar, June 2; Granada, June 5; Colorado River, June 4 and 5; and Gila River, June 8.

When family plans require a child to leave a center school before the official closing date, full credit will be given the pupil if his work has been above average, Myer said.

No make-up classes will be presented during the summer since all Manzanar children are prepared to enter schools.

Since many evacuee instructors are leaving there will be only a limited program of adult education based on the number of evacuee instructors who remain in the center.

There will be a four weeks summer activity program under Community Activities, June 18, to July 15. High school library will close at once. Library 22 will remain open. Children's library in block 17 will remain open. Toy and library will remain open. Four WPA teachers will be detailed to the summer activity program with assistance of evacuee teachers.

Most of the teachers have made their plans for the fall accepting other positions. A few may accept positions in other departments and remain under center closings. Education sections in such cases. Buildings will be turned over to property control the first week in June.

Inventory of school 4-5-6 of June. Keys to be turned over to Property control.

Except for a few special assignments all teachers will be returned from educational assignments June 9.

Mess Division Staff Totals 725 Workers

A total of 1995 center residents are on the War Relocation Authority's payroll, as of April 30, 1945, according to statistics compiled by Frances Yokoyama of the Personnel Division.

The mess division leads all other sections with a staff of 725 while the engineering section comes in second with a manpower of 505 and a half workers.

Other departments and sections are as follows:

Project director, 65; legal aid, two and a half; reports, 15; relocation, 11 and three-fourths; internal security, 32, health, 139; education, 53; welfare (including the children's village), 63 and a half; community activities, 33 and a fourth; government, one; agricultural, 40; fire department, 53; motor pool, 51; supply section, 50 and a half; personnel management, seven and a half; evacuee property, 34; finance office, 31 and three-fourths; statistics, eight and three-fourths; and business enterprises, one.

Has Information On State Land Laws

Center residents desiring information on the laws of the various states regarding ownership, leasing an occupancy of lands by aliens of various classes as well as the new Oregon Alien Land Law and a draft of an agreement for the operations of land in Oregon by an alien ineligible to citizenship, should contact Project Attorney Alan G. Campbell in the Legal Aid Section, according to the announcement received by the Free Press.

There are 18 states in which there are no pertinent restrictions against aliens who are ineligible for citizenship. In four states, there are no restrictions upon residents. In New Jersey, there is no restriction upon a Japanese alien who is not interned and who is permitted to do business with the federal government. In some other states, there are restrictions with respect to the length of time that the land may be owned or with respect to the amount of land which may be

zoned for residential use. Project Attorney states that he will be glad to advise any interested evacuee concerning these laws.

FAMILY MEMBERS, CLOSE FRIEND ALLOWED VISITS

Effective tomorrow new regulations will go into effect at the Manzanar Base Hospital limiting to members of the immediate family and a closest friend as designated by the patient, according to an announcement from Dr. Morse Little, principal medical officer.

The following is a copy of the hospital statement:

"Effective May 27, 1945, only persons of the immediate family or the closest friend, as designated by the patient, will be admitted as visitors during the scheduled visiting hours. These hours are Tuesday, 7 to 8 p.m., Thursday, 7 to 8 p.m., and Sunday, 2 to 3 p.m. It is requested that no one attempt to visit patients at any other time.

"The hospital regrets that this action is necessary but due to the shortage of personnel, the work cannot be efficiently carried on when too many people gather in the wards.

"Unless we have the full cooperation of the Manzanar residents in conforming with these regulations, it will be necessary to discontinue visiting hours entirely."

Anti-Japanese Sign Erected In Orosi By Unidentified Persons

FRESNO, Calif.—A sign reading, "Not Japs Wanted in This District" was erected by unidentified persons at the corner of Palm Ave. and El Monte Way in the center of Orosi, the Fresno Bee revealed.

The sign, measuring 20 inches wide by 4 1/2 feet tall, is evidently the work of an expert sign painter, the paper stated.

C. F. Schliecher, realtor who won the corner, said that the sign was erected without his knowledge but that he will not remove it.

Constable John Shadden declared that the "sign is on private property and a license is not required to erect signs on private property in Orosi."

Meanwhile, District Attorney Walter C. Haight stated that the members of his office will try moral persuasion for the sign's removal in the interest of community peace.

Coastal Return By 12,000 Estimated

WASHINGTON, D.C.—Dillon S. Myer, war relocation authority director, disclosed recently that an estimated 12,000 Japanese-Americans will return from relocation centers to civilian life in the nine counties of southern California by January 1, 1946, stated the Los Angeles Daily News.

Myer added that some 11,420 others have indicated their intention to resettle there, and that some 580 evacuees have already returned to southern California.

Some 55,000 persons are still in relocation centers who have been cleared by the army and are therefore eligible for relocation.

COMMITTEE AIDS NISEI IN SEATTLE

SEATTLE, Wash. — Seven members of the American Friends Service Committee painted out the "No Japs Wanted" signs and other crudely painted remarks which greeted Mr. and Mrs. Shigeo Nagaisa when they returned to their home from a WRA center, the Seattle Times revealed.

Led by Floyd Schmoee, secretary, the five Quakers also cut the grass, grown long and neglected during the family's absence.

One of the signs declared, "Get out of town because there are too many true Americans that intend to get even with your race for what they have done to our boys."

"I'm a mother with two boys lying wounded in a hospital, and another in China. All I can say is get out of our city. We... have too many worries at present to rid the town of Japs—but wait until this war is over. You will see."

This and other letters were turned over to the WRA. They advised her not to fear for "you will be protected. This must be a law-abiding nation. If you request protection, you will get it."

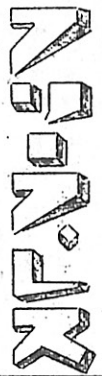

タイムズ 社説

チヨリナル首相は五月廿三日議院を以てシ、六世皇帝に呈せし國令は六月十五日公式に解散せしむる七月五日は從選考である。
