MAJORITY OF CIO MEN SIGN PLEDGE CARDS

SAN FRAiICISCO .-n Between 50 to 60 per cent of the CIO Warehousemen's Local No. Six Union, who had refused to work with persons of Japanese ancestry signed the anti-discrimination pledge cards by the dead-. line late last week, the San Francisco Chronicle revealed. Those who did not sign were suspended and will be cited to the local's executive board with the recommendation that they be brought to trial and expelled.

The pledge card reads:
"I, as member of the $I_{n-}$ ternational Longshoremen and Warehousemen's Union, will not refuse to work with any person because of such person's race, color, or creed, including Americans of Japanese origin. ${ }^{\text {N }}$
