MAJORITY OF CIO MEN-

SAN FRANCISCO -- Between 50 to 60 per cent of the CIO Warehousemen's Local No. Six Union, who had refused to work with persons of Japanese ancestry signed the anti - discrimination pledge cards by the deadline late last week, the Francisco Chronicle revealed. Those who did not sign were suspended and will be cited to the local's executive board with the recommendation that they be brought to trial and expelled.

The pledge card reads:
"I, as member of the International Longshoremen
and Warehousemen's Union,
will not refuse to work
with any person because of
such person's race, color,
or creed, including Americans of Japanese origin."

President Richard Lynden of the union made it plain that the unit should "keep the work moving" in the (Continued on Page Two)

HOLLYWOOD FILM STUDIO SEEKS JAPANESE ACTORS

From 20 to 25 men between the ages of 25 to 35 are wanted immediately by a motion picture studio to play the role of Japanese soldiers in a movie which will be screened in Puerto Rico, according to an announcement from the Relocation Office, Building 1-4.

Production will start early in July and will last from six to eight weeks.

DISCRIMINATION, FASCISM, HUMAN DEGRATION SAYS CIO SECRETARY_TREASURER JAMES B. CAREY

SAN FRANCISCO, May 30 or group of individuals Memorial Day, 1945, Addicated by the Congress of Industrial Organizations, "to those who have died so that others yet unborn might be free, should be a special remeinder to CIO and liberty to any other members that discrimination individual because of difand fascish alike mean hudegradation, " says man ' James B. Caroy, secretary-treasurer of the CIO, .chairman of the CIO Committoe to Abolish Discrinination and consultant to the American Delegation of the United Mations Conference here.

"Wo, together with the other free people of the world, have waged one of those wars to victory in surope; we and our loyal allies are determined to carry the war with Japan to a similar victorious conclusion. Our fight is for the innate rights of human beings, " says Caroy's instatement.

"These rights must not be confused with man-made decisions. The rights derive from the natural law. and hence any individual

FRESNO FAMILY VICTIM OF TWO SHOOTING RAIDS FROM AUTOMOBILE
