Returning from Los Angeles, where he had gone on a business trip, Lyle Wentner, assistant project director stated that various people of the outside are working hard to convince the residents of Manzanar to relocate.

Visiting three hostels the assistant project director inspected the Buddhist Hostel at 1336 West 36th place and met the Reverend and Mrs. Inamura, the Reverend Goldwater and Arthur Takenoto. This hostel has accommodations for 35 people.

On his itinerary was the Methodists Hostel at 350 South Normandie where he met the Reverend and Mrs. Yamada. This hostel ac-

AKSEL NIELSEN TERMINATES; ACCEPTS UNRRA POSITION

Coming here on April 8, 1942, as chief of the recreation section under the Wartime Civil Control Administration, Community Activities Section Supervisor Aksel Nielsen terminated his work with the War Relocation Authority this week to accept an offer as assistant director of the United Nations Relief and Rehabilitation Administration Assembly Center in Germany where refugees, former slave laborers and prisoners-of-war are handled.

He is to report in Washington, D.C. on June 28 from where he will proceed to Maryland to begin his UNRRA course on June 29.

His wife, Melva Nielson, arrived here on August 1, 1942 and became music instructor of the center in January, 1943. She quit her work on July, 1944 and worked

NEGRO BOY KILLED IN ATTACK BY WHITE MEN

CHICAGO—Howard Contry, a 16-year-old Negro boy was shot through the heart and killed recently as he walked with two other Negroes in a white industrial section in which there have been reports of racial friction, the Los Angeles Tribune reports.

The Tribune revealed that the shot came from a group of a dozen or more white men who attacked the Negroes as they emerged from the Chicago Mail Order Co., where they were all employed.

The dead boy's companion, Willie Thomas, suffered a severe head wound and Leonard Moore was cut on the head by a brick.

GILA EMPLOYEE FACES EMBEZZLEMENT CHARGES

LOS ANGELES — Albert F. Chamberlin, former evacuee property officer at the Gila River, Ariz., Relocation Center, was taken into custody this week at Sunset Beach on embezzlement charges concerning a Southern California Japanese American, the Los Angeles Times stated.

FORMER BLOCK MANAGER ACQUIRES GROCERY STORE

Ed Yuge, former produce man in Los Angeles and a former Manzanar resident, acquired a grocery store in Washington, D.C., according to word received at the project.

Yuge, who was once a block manager of block 15 and who later worked at the Relocation Office is requesting his sister-in-law, Hisayo Yoshida to come to Washington to assist him.

AMERICAN SOLDIERS 'PUZZLED' AT UNFAIR TREATMENT OF NISEI

American soldiers, who have fought side by side with the Japanese American soldiers of the famed 442nd Infantry Regiment, don't like the unfair treatment of racial groups, Clote Roberts, Blue Network correspondent, reported, according to the Los Angeles Tribune.

He added that the American soldiers in Italy, knowing how well the Japanese American soldiers fought, are puzzled about such actions as anti-Nisei riots, which have broken out on the Pacific Coast.

POSTON NISEI CONVICTED FOR EVASION OF DRAFT

PHOENIX, Ariz.—Ninety-eight Poston Nisei, were sentenced to one year in prison by U.S. Judge Dave W. Ling last week for failure to heed their draft notices, the Los Angeles Times reports.

The Nisei, most of them from California, asserted that they were exempt from the draft since they were in effect military prisoners at the relocation center, the Times announced.

EVACUEES REQUESTED TO WATCH CRATING OPERATIONS AT MESS 4

Evacuees who are having personal property crated for shipment are urgently requested to accompany their goods to mess hall four, and watch the crating operation.

This announcement comes from Evacuee Property Officer David S. Bronley, who adds that this is being requested in order to help avoid any misunderstanding when goods are shipped.

Each evacuee should then go to mess hall two after crating is completed and sign requests for transportation of their personal property.

"Every effort is being made to satisfactorily crate and ship this property and we want the evacuees to see just how their goods are crated and prepared for shipment", Bronley said.

ARMY REVEALS NISEI

CASUALTIES TOTAL 2111

ARMY HEADQUARTERS, PACIFIC OCEAN AREAS—Japanese American soldiers in Europe suffered 2111 casualties to date, an Army survey showed.

They covered battles in Italy and France including 361 killed in action, 49 died of wounds, 1651 wounded, 34 missing and six captured, stated the San Francisco Chronicle.

RAY KAYANO CHOSEN TO CONDUCT ORCHESTRA

Ray Kayano, long-time member of the Manzanar Community Orchestra, has been chosen to succeed former conductor Mrs. Ak-sel Nielson, it was announced recently.

ARMY OFFICIALS ARRIVE TO COMMENCE HEARINGS

Army representatives from the Western Defense Headquarters at Persidio, San Francisco, Calif., arrived here this week and will hold hearings commencing today for those who are restricted in their movements and who have asked for an appeal.

Residents who are on the stop list and who desire hearings should contact Project Attorney Alan G. Campbell immediately or write directly to the commanding general of the Western Defense Command asking for an appeal. They will then receive notices of the date of their hearings.

FIRE PERMITS NECESSARY FOR ALL SOCIAL EVENTS

Residents planning parties or entertainment must get a fire permit from the Fire Department announced fire Chief Woodhouse.

Persons assuming the responsibility for these affairs may get the permit at the Fire Department. The permit should be filled out and signed by the block manager as well as the persons taking the responsibility.

486 EVACUEES RESETTLE TO CALIFORNIA IN WEEK

Returns to California on Terminal Departure reached a new high for the week ending June 9, during which time 486 persons returned home, a Washington survey shows.

During the same week, 1304 persons relocated from all centers including 158 from Manzanar. Illinois was the second most popular state and received 159 persons.

PROJECT ATTORNEY GIVES OFFICE HOURS FOR LEGAL ASSISTANCE

Residents who wish to see Project Attorney Alan G. Campbell, or who wish to have papers notarized or to secure other assistance from the Legal Aid office should go to the office only on week day afternoons between 1:30 and 4:30 p.m., Project Attorney Alan Campbell declared.

He added that "unless there is an emergency, I will not be able to talk to people who have not made appointments in advance."

"This is necessary because we have not been able to secure the services of a qualified business counselor and interpreter, and because we are short of stenographic assistance."

The wedding was performed by Capt. Willard E. Learned, Army Air Forces chaplain, and both participants were unattended.

The couple will make their home in Lone Pine, Calif.

RECORDS OFFICE CENSUS SHOWS 1152 FAMILIES LEFT IN MANZANAR

A census compiled by the Records Office as of June 15, 1945, shows that there are approximately 1152 families left in this center.

A breakdown of the family size follows:

There are 86 families with one member; 362 families with two members; 259 families with three members; 187 families with four members; 140 families with five members; 59 families with six members; 36 families with seven members; 14 families with eight members; two families with nine members; four families with ten members; two families with 11 members and one family with 12 members.

MYER SAYS MAJORITY

TO RELOCATE TO EAST

Over two-thirds of the Japanese who were evacuated from the West Coast early in 1942; will resettle in the Midwest and Eastern states when the WRA closes its centers on January 2, 1946, the Los Angeles Daily News reports in quoting WRA Director Dillon S. Myer.

Myer declared that out of the 49,000 released from the relocation centers, only 4000 have returned to California.

Sec. 53--"It is unlawful for any corporation, person, or association, or the proprietor, leases, or the agents of either, of any opera house, theater, melodeon, museum, circus, caravan, race course fair, or other place of public amusement or entertainment, to refuse admittance to any person over the age of twenty-one years who presents a ticket of admission acquired by purchase, or who tenders the price thereof for such ticket, and who demands admission to such place. Any person under the influence of liquor, or who is guilty of boisterous conduct, or any person of lewd or immoral character, may be excluded from such place of amusement.

Sec. 54--"Any person who is refused admission to any place of amusement contrary to the provision of the last preceding section, is entitled to recover from the proprietor, leases, or their agents, or from any such person, corporation, or association or the director thereof, his actual damages and one hundred dollars in addition thereto.
