## RE TURNING NISEI SOLDIERS

 TO BE AIDED BY NEV FLANLAKA GARDA, Italy--White officors of the 442nd American Infentry Regiment, disgusted with the discrimination afainst persons of Japanesc ancestry along the U.S. West Coast, have organized thoir oum replacoment plan for the Jenanesc American vetorans who are now returning to the homeland under the 35 point system, the Army Stars and Stripos reports.

## MIMNEAPOLIS JAPANESE

May Okamoto, who came to Minneapolis in September of 1943, is the first ivisei to open a beauty shop in the liinnesota district. Because of the large Japanese American population in the Twin Cities, the relocation officer, James Hiner, Jr., predicts "Hay's Beauty Salon" will be a hugo success,

Missouri'q Reprosontative Cannon, chairmen of the Appropriations Committee, submitted a report in explanation of the bill which contained proposed 1946 fiscal appropriations for war agencios, and included this statement regarding WRA:
"This is the lest appropriation which vill be required for the IRA which is charged $u$ ith the rossponsibility for the care of those persons of Japanese origin ovacuated from the west coast in the winter of 1942. A considerable number, probably 18, 000 out of the total of 117,000 Japanese persons, originally u:cher the jur-isdiction of tho Wer Relocation Authority, will be detained at Tule Iake center and turned over to Department of Justice authorities. They fall in two catagories--those determined by invostication to be undesirable to remain in the United States, and those who have expressed a preference, to be roturned to Japen. Of the remaining group, all but 53,000 have already been relocated outside the centers. The 53,000 will be relocated at tiac rate of six or sevon thousand per month and such persons will have left the centers by the end of the oolendar year of 1945. it . that point, the Var Relocation Authority will have no further responsibility for the care and custody of those persons and during the remaining si: months of the fiscel year will wind up its ousiness affairs and be antircly out of business by june 30 , 1946.

## DILLON FYER REDUKES SEAATOR TENNEY'S REMARKS

LOS AHGELES_-Spoaking in the Thornc Hall at Occidontal Collego rocently, WRA Dircctor Dillon S. Myor robuked Stato Son. Jack B. Tonnoy's rocont remark thet Japanoso Amcricans and alions with an opon and notoriously disloyal attitudo are being rolcased by tho WRA to work in war plants and on wharves and docks, the Los Angeles Daily liows reports.

Myor declared, "The sonator's romarks could havo beon mado only from ignorance or malice. By now overy intclligont porson should know that the army lifted its mass exclusion order becauso tho military nocd for cxclusion no longer exists.
"Cortainly a state som
ator should inow that tno war depertment is solcly rosponsiblc, and alveys has becx, for chocleing each individual and determining oxactly who will and who will not be permitted back on the Wost Coast."

Nyor seid that as long as race baiting myths aro fostered and repeated by "unthinking pcoplc, just so long is a victorious Amorica in danger of succumbing to the historic principle of war that the culture of the conquered will provail. Thoso things arc ovidence of the culture which was Naziism.
"Hitlor is doad, but I ropeat what has boon said bofore; here is ovidence that Hitler won a victory in Amorica."
