In October of 1942, Berman successfully settled a serious dispute involving furlough workers and employers in Montana. Ber-(Continued on Page 4)



(Cont'd from Page One) tion problem which we considered unsolvable....It is highly important that we continue rendering this individualized type of assistance in relocation until the very end of the program. In order to do this effectively. however, we must have a comparatively even flow of movement out of the centers over the next several months. Such a movement is essential in order to insure continuously efficient service in individual or family counseling, in travel arrangements for the relocators, in transportation or personal property, in finding housing accommoitions for resettlers, and in all the lines of relocation assistance which WRA is now in excellent position to provide.

We have considered the coblem of rendering adequate assistance on an individual basis to every eligible family and every person still residing in relocation centers. We have also given attention to the shortage of transportation facilities which will inevitably become
