## TELETYPE FROM MYER REVEALS CLOSING DATE OF WRA CENTERS

Closing dates for all of the WRA relocation centers, with the exception of Tule Lake, were disclosed late last week in a teletype to the project from WRA Director Dillon S. Myer.

Following is the schedule of the closing dates:

### EDWARD BERMAN ARRIVES TO AID IN RELOCATION

Edward Berman, relocation officer for the district office in Newark, N.J., arrived here Monday morning to aid future resettlers who are interested in the Newark area.

Berman is well-known to many evacuees because he has been with the WRA since 1942 and has done much to help persons of Japanese ancestry in various ways.

He is well-liked by many Manzanar people because of his sincere and intelligent efforts.

Prior to being the relocation officer in Newark, he was WRA's employment investigator in Idaho, Montana and Oregon, and did much toward aiding the boys on furlough.

In October of 1942, Berman successfully settled a serious dispute involving furlough workers and employers in Montana. Ber-

Myer's teletype read in part:

As you all know, WRA is primarily a service organization. Its main job is to help the people in relocation centers become established once again in private life. During the past three years in helping over 45,000 people to relocate, we have encountered almost every conceivable type of resettlement problem.

"We have been able to help the relocators in working out their own distinctive problems and in making an adequate adjustment. Never once have we found an individual or family reloca-

While in Manzanar, he worked as a linoleum cutter, carving out prints for the Manzanar Free Press.

tion problem which we considered unsolvable.... It is highly important that we continue rendering this individualized type of assistance in relocation until the very end of the program. In order to do this effectively, however, we must have a comparatively even flow of movement out of the centers over the next several months. Such a movement is essential in order to insure continuously efficient service in individual or family counseling, in travel arrangements for the relocators, in transportation or personal property, in finding housing accommodations for resettlers, and in all the lines of relocation assistance which WRA is now in excellent position to provide.

We have considered the problem of rendering adequate assistance on an individual basis to every eligible family and every person still residing in relocation centers. We have also given attention to the shortage of transportation facilities which will inevitably become

more acute in the fall months as additional thousands of troops are redeployed across the country. Because of these pressing considerations, we have decided on a gradual schedule for closing relocation centers over a period of two months instead of closing them all simultaneously.

"In order to assure an even, orderly movement from the centers and a well planned program of assistance, it is essential that all residents should decide where they wish to relocate by September 1 at the latest. Our advice and assistance to you cannot be made effective until you have made that basic decision. I am greatly pleased with the high degree of success achieved by the more than 45,000 evacuees who already left relocation centers. The WRA is prepared to assist every one of you to make a similar successful readjustment. As I have indicated on various occasions at the centers there is no such word as 'can't' either in the vocabulary of center residents or in the vocabulary of WRA."

### CIVIL LIBERTIES UNION OFFERS \$1000 REWARD FOR NISEI ATTACKERS

SACRAMENTO -- Since the state law does not permit the payment of rewards from public funds, the American Civil Liberties Union will pay a reward of \$1000 for information leading to the arrest and conviction of any person attacking a Japanese in California, Attorney General Robert W. Kenny announced, according to the San Francisco Chronicle.

Kenny stated that the identity of the person earning a reward would not be revealed.

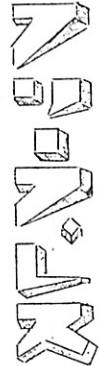

### 二世兵を絶讃する司令官

米陸上軍の司令官千人以上の死傷を出し、なるシヤコブ、レデバール将軍は二万五千五百七十九人の日系兵を以て全米の日報の中で最優秀な軍人の中に数へると発表した。彼はバサデナ市にある一団体を以て日系人脅迫運動に反対する結社であるが、此れに一書を送つて曰く、

余が熱烈な希望は、米國が國の爲めに戦い犠牲を払つた兵士の一切を忘れず、此れ一草である。然してこの兵士達の中には二世も混つて居るのだ、彼等は實に勇敢に戦つたが今彼等には休養が必要だ。この手紙はWRAより公閱されたものであるが、同氏の言に従はば二世兵の間に、三

千人以上の死傷を出し、居るとの事である。この公閱は檢事総長のケニー氏が去る火曜日に成した加州内で日本人を攻撃した者と本人を攻撃した者とを報告した者に一千円の賞金を出すと云ふ声明に於いてなされたものである。
