## SWITZERLAND TO REPRESENT JAPANESE INTERESTS IN U.S.

Switzerland, a neutral country, will now take over the representation of the Japanese interests in this country for the duration of the war, the State Department disclosed in a press release recently.

This agreement was made between Japan, Switzerland and the United States when the Japanese and the Japanese War Ministry told the Swiss Government that it would agree in principle to permit the Swiss Minister in Japan to visit prisoner-of-war camps in Japan and Japanese-occupied territories, which heretofore had been denied.

Since late March, 1945 when the Spanish Government relinquished the protection of Japanese interests in the continental United States, the Japanese Government had been without neutral representation in the United States. As distinct from the interruption of the representation of Japanese interest in the United States, the Swiss Government has continued to represent American interest in Japan and Japanese occupied territory, as it has since the beginning of the war.

An announcement from the State Department states, "When these camps (in the Far East) have been visited, this government will be able to obtain from the

## DR. OBO SAKAGUCHI DIES AFTER FEW DAYS' ILLNESS

Dr. Obo Toshikazu Sakaguchi, 30, dentist at the Manzanar Base Hospital, died Friday at the Los Angeles General Hospital, where he was taken a few weeks ago, according to an announcement received at the project.

Dr. Sakaguchi is the third member of his family to die within six months. His sister, Chico, died in Philadelphia on February 20, 1945 while his father, Shichiro Sakaguchi died

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## AN HONEST MAN

For the umptysteenth time since Mr. Truman became President, Harold Ickes is reported about to step out of the cabinet. This time the report has the convincing feed box label on it.

Nevertheless, we shall withhold belief until it is official. And then we shall be saddened. Taking Ickes out of the cabinet will be like dealcoholizing a cock-tail. For 12 years he sat there, the national screaming mania, whose picturesque denunciations made political and economic tycoon flinch and fume.

He was a master of political Billingsgate, the all-American mudslinger, but there was merit in his mud, and his choice of targets was wonderful. He enriched the lexicon of vituperation with such priceless gems as "barefoot Wall street lawyer". He called the turn of more scoundrels and phonies than any man in his period. Someone coined the term "Old Curmudgeon" in tribute to his ability to dish it out.

With it all, Ickes was able and incorruptible in discharging the vast responsibilities put upon him. His department was a model of administrative efficiency in a regime where administration was supposed to have been the Achilles heel.

He kept the public plunderers, who once found rich hunting in the Interior Department, at super-safe distance. When President Truman was casting about for a successor, he asked several men in high places who was the "best man for the Interior". The reply he got was: "The best man is in there now".

So here's to the Old Curmudgeon. He is crusty. He is tough. He is a name-calling soandso. But he is a man -- and an honest one.

## POSTON EVACUEE WORKERS TERMINATE EMPLOYMENT

POSTON, Ariz.—Evacuee workers in Units II and III of the Poston Relocation Center were notified recently by their Project Director Duncan Mills that their employment will be terminated not later than August 31 with the exception of kitchen workers, the Poston Chronicle announced.

The Chronicle added:

"Some activities in the two units will be discontinued entirely on or before that date but essential service will be carried on through September by the use of evacuee crews from Unit I and an increased appointed staff. Employees will be notified by their respective supervisors of the termination dates of specific activities."

## BERMAN LEAVES CENTER AFTER RELOCATING 25

Edward Berman, relocation officer from Newark, New Jersey, completed a successful three weeks visit to the center when he left for Gila Relocation Center on Saturday evening. During his stay, ten Manzanar families totaling twenty-five persons accepted offers Mr. Berman made them in Philadelphia, New York City and Sussex County, New Jersey.

In addition to these, thirty-two persons have accepted Mr. Berman's offers, but have not, as yet, set a definite date for their departure.

Swiss Government more complete reports of the conditions under which Americans are held by the Japanese. It is hoped that Japanese treatment of American Nationals will thereby be improved. For these reasons the United States Government is glad to have the Swiss Government assume the protection of Japanese interests in the United States.

The United States Government in accordance with its treaty obligations and international commitments permits representatives of the protecting powers to visit all camps where enemy nationals are held.

In the exchange of communications between the Swiss Legation and the State Department, Grassli, charge d'affaires of Switzerland Ad Interim, declared in a letter to Acting Secretary of State Joseph C. Grew:

"I have the honor to inform you that the Japanese Government has asked the Swiss Federal Council to take charge of the Japanese interests in the United States (with the exception of Hawaii) for the duration of the war. Subject to American consent, the Swiss Government has declared its willingness to assume this responsibility.

"I should be very much obliged, therefore, if you would be good enough to advise me whether the American Government is prepared to give the consent sought by my government."

Grew's reply in part was as follows:

Japanese nationals in the United States are advised of their right to communicate with the Swiss Legation, Washington, D. C. on any of the matters which they would normally take up with the Protecting Power.

## VIRGIL PAYNE RESIGNS WRA JOB TO ACCEPT UNRRA EMPLOYMENT

CLEVELAND, Ohio.—Virgil Payne, assistant supervisor of the Great Lakes area of the WRA office, resigned his position to accept an overseas assignment with the UNRRA, the Cleveland WRA Office announced.

Louise Noble, relocation adjustment advisor, became the assistant supervisor of the area effective July 16.

Miss Payne has been with the area office since September, 1944, when she transferred from the Heart Mountain, Wyo., Relocation Center where she served as the Welfare director.

Her new assignment will give her the opportunity to participate in the rehabilitation of Europe. She is now at the UNRRA Training Center, University of Maryland.

## ASK RECONSIDERATION OF NISEI MEMBERSHIP

SPOKANE, Wash.—Over 500 combat veterans at the Baxtor General Hospital signed a petition this week asking a Spokane Veterans of Foreign War post to reconsider its rejection of a membership application from a wounded Japanese American veteran of the Italian Campaign, the San Francisco Chronicle said.

"We feel strongly," the Veteran Anti-Prejudice Committee said, "that the prejudice of few members which resulted in Pfc. Richard H. Wai to's rejections, has no place in American life...This is not what we fought for in this war and it will not help our buddies in the Pacific who still have a job to do."

Dr. Sakaguchi arrived in Manzanar on August 5, 1942 from Del Rey, Calif., and went to Gila Rivers Center where he worked as a dentist until August 1, 1943. Returning here, he began his dentistry work at the Manzanar Base Hospital.

He received his pre-medical course at the Glendale Jr. College in Glendale, Calif., and studied at the University of Southern California from 1937 to 1941. From 1941 to 1942, he practiced for Dr. Ono, a dentist in Los Angeles.

During 1931 to 1939, Dr. Sakaguchi was an assistant Scout Master in Burbank, Calif.

Dr. Sakaguchi married Yoshiko Kubota on November 4, 1944, at the Manzanar Buddhist Church.

### FLORISTS BOYCOTT JAPANESE NURSERY

SEATTLE, Wash.—Seattle florists refused to buy blooms of George Kawachi, recently returned Kisei, the Seattle Times reports.

The Times states that the florists admit scarcity of flowers and that Japanese are good nurserymen but are "afraid" of public sentiment against Japanese.

Kawachi donates blooms to veterans hospitals and has three relatives overseas in the service.

### TWO OFFICERS OPPOSE RACIAL DISCRIMINATION

Captain George H. Grandstaff and Lieut. Norman C. Mitchell, who have been addressing West Coast audiences on the subject of racial bigotry, say "we do not like the un-American race hatred we have found at home.", the Los Angeles Daily News stated in an editorial recently.

Captain Grandstaff said "It is a waste of time to argue with people haunted by deep ethnic prejudices. But if we are to avoid falling into the abyss into which Germany finally plunged, we shall need in America a continuous, expansive program of racial tolerance and interracial education."

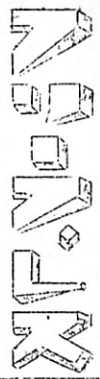

ホスグム合議は終結して、將來の戦争の種と稱した「致命の十六日間」は秘密外交の合意と知らる、時が来たら歴史の表題とさる、である。民主共和米國主義英國全体主義共產露國の合議の結果として六千語の共同声明は古今の史上に比ひなき経綸外交の未曾有の奇案の一である。

露國は戦は終結して居る米國は戦に射下である合議の長文の公報に露國が日米戦に参加し米人の立場と激励する語句は少しも無い。過去若くは米人は三ヶ年間沈黙の露國は何れ其内には好意を見せるでたらふと、それは空想のみである。其れはヘランヤル夕更に今回のホスグムが其れであつた。

米軍の赤の簽箱は欲するまゝに得て居る。露國は小事に就き強歩するも重要目的と希望に就ては一步も退かず露國に主張するもして使者はワルマン大統領のイキス國務卿は前任者より強硬外交主張するものと見え、併しヤルタ契約が固まるとしてはかくしい新取柄も出来なかつた。ホスグム合議はスタリンの元帥は徳界者として露國は歐洲の優等國として是認された。英米兩國はスタリンの要求に依りポーランド共產政府と露の選べるオーストリア政府と承認するから米軍もホスグム公報は報じてゐる。

露共産專政者英社會黨首相米民主國大統領は独逸國及び國民は是れ解と宣言しなが
