Dr. Obo Toshikazu Sakaguchi, 30, dentist at the manzanar Baso Hospital, died Friday at the Los $n_{n}$ geles Goneral Hospital, where he was taken a fev weaks ago, according to an announcement roceived at the projoct.
Dr. Sakagucini is the third nember of his family to die zithin six months. His sister, Chico, died in Phil dolphia on ebruary 20, 1945 while his father, Shiichiro Sakaguchi died
